COURSE MANAGEMENT REPORT - DECEMBER 2019

Firstly I hope everyone had a happy safe Christmas / New Year period. December on the course was busy with the top Bowls green major renovation, growing in the newly planted Couch areas, and non-stop wind.

We now focus on preparations for the upcoming Bowls season re-commencement/exhibition day Wed. Jan 8th and the Pro-Am Mon. Jan. 27th.

Please be aware that extreme weather days will lead to **NO GOLF CART USE** and possible Course closures. Protection of the Course is paramount during this summer period.

Greens The Greens have had numerous applications of a liquid Calcium product. This is to aid in any salt build ups from longer periods of irrigation with Bore water and lack of rainfall to help flush the soil profile. We have done three herbicide applications, spaced ten days apart, for Poa annua control, and the results have varied from green to green. We have stopped the monthly verti-draining due to the weather, and herbicide applications. We will be applying sand as a dusting to greens to smooth out the surfaces from where the Poa annua has died or stressed out.

Some yellowing of turf around green edges will become noticeable. This will be caused by high application rates of growth regulator. This has been undertaken on areas where the Couch grass invasion on greens is very prominent.

Bowling Greens Both Greens were bowling well, and early Dec. gave us the chance to bi-annually renovate the top green. The process involved double scarify in two directions to a depth of 15mm; the green was then blown off and shaved down. We then tried coring the green with 13mm tynes to a depth of 1.5 inches but were unable to pull cores as the surface disruption was too much.

We then again used the shaver to remove more material from the greens surface, the green was again blown off to remove any excess sand or grass. Another two shavings of the green then took place followed by a double mowing. This process has allowed us to remove the maximum amount of thatch from the green top (some 12 Workman loads of material). In total we applied around 4m³ of topdressing media then broomed the sand across the green. The media used for topdressing this year was a blend of a local dark grey sand mixed with a product called Revive which is best explained as a composted material containing NPK nutrients, trace elements and sources to improve soil moisture retention and improve Cation exchange levels. The green top was continually screened and rubbed in via a tow behind brush. Currently I am extremely happy with the greens recovery and I hope to see the green back in play in coming weeks.

Tees Divoting of tees will be on a fortnightly or as needs basis. All tees are planned for Growth regulator and fertiliser applications.

Fairways The scarified fairways have been fertilised with granular and liquid fertiliser to aid recovery. Wetting agent and heavy watering are planned to take place during the 2nd week of January. Again, a huge thank-you to all members who came to help throw out the sprigs for planting. All areas are progressing well with a great strike.

Bunkers General maintenance has taken place including edging, spraying for weeds and grasses and sand leveling on bases. Strong recent winds will call for more sand additions in bunkers and if winds persist we will look at hand watering bunker bases to help in sand movement on the bunker floors.



HISTORY

Ron Healey - Club Historian



EXCERPTS FROM MINUTE BOOK COMPRISING 349 PAGES DATING FROM 6TH MARCH, 1947 TO 12TH SEPTEMBER 1957.



Very little from the **meeting of June 13, 1952**, the Ferguson Attachment rough mower after demonstration proved to be unsatisfactory and other alternatives to be looked at in the future.

A spraying outfit has been looked at and member Mr Cameron has offered to lend his outfit to the Club until a suitable machine can be found.

The Gippsland & Junior Gippsland Championships to be held concurrently over 36 holes and an entry fee of 10 shillings covering events be charged to each player.

As very little profit was being made from the sale of Ale the charge for a 5 oz. (about 140ml) glass was increased by 2 pence to 9 pence a glass.

On **July 11, 1952** a special meeting of Executive, Social, Associates and Associates Social Committees was held to organise the events to be held in conjunction with the Annual Tournament.

Friday Night Ball in Mechanics Hall, responsible for Music A. Callaway, Catering Associates and refreshments J. Pallot Quota 2 x 18's. Saturday Morning N. Roberts with utility for clean-up.

Saturday Night Associates to arrange function in Picnic Point Hall the charge will be 10/- shillings per male member as associates will be providing most of the food. A quota was set of 4 x 9's, just in case they only drink 27 gallons?? (however there was a comment that any additional ale would result on a further charge to all present).

The ladies have requested that trophies be presented after close of play on Wednesday and Thursday of the Tournament by the Club President where possible.

Bar, Prices to be 10 pence for 6 oz., 6 pence for 4 oz. and all spirits 1/6 per nobbler.

Members to be co-opted for barmen and an application be made for a quota of 13 x 18 gallons and 10 x 9 gallons, bar to be constructed on Sunday prior to Tournament.

This was followed by an Ordinary Meeting where one of the items discussed was drainage around the Club House, a quotation had been received for 6/- per foot for 120 feet of concrete drainage, however it was agreed that a wooden drain ?? be constructed on a different line as a temporary measure.

A report was received that the Greenkeeper had applied for another job which he did not get, it was suggested the Mr. F. Morecroft discuss the matter informally with Greenkeeper Mr Greenwood "to find out what the true position is".

The next **meeting was October 3, 1952** and the matter of fairway spraying was discussed, a quote was received for 1 pound per acre and the greens committee was empowered to spend up to 50 pounds for such spraying.

Greenkeeper Mr Greenwood was still about and was granted a bonus of 10 pounds for additional work done at Tournament time. Another motion was accepted that War Savings Certificates to the value of 125 pounds be redeemed.

Following a discussion on a proposed site for a new course at Eagle Point it was left to Messrs. Bayley & Potter to contact the owner of the paddock in question.

Afternoon teas for 1953 were set to consist of biscuits & tea only, a motion was moved that Closing Day Ale be provided at no charge, an amendment was put that a charge of 6 pence a glass be applied. This was lost and the original motion passed.

Mrs Maggs was back in the minutes (those who have followed these writings will be aware of Mrs Maggs the lady who was involved in a lot of catering around the club) the President was asked to purchase an article to the value of 5 pounds for a present to the lady.



HISTORY (cont.)

The final meeting for 1952 was held on December 3, and the Treasurer reported a bank overdraft of 230 pounds but followed a motion that Mr Greenwood the greenkeeper be paid a bonus of 20 pounds. (They would appear to be working hard to keep him.)

In relation to the new course it was agreed that it was at present better to spend money on the existing course rather than a new site. In light of this, expert advice was to be obtained as to methods of improving the existing course generally and in particular the low portions of the fairways.

On Sunday December 4, the committee met and witnessed a demonstration of a "Hayden" rough mower cutting both long and short rough, it proved to be very efficient and was going to save considerable time over existing methods. The committee approved the purchase of the Mower and attachments at a cost of 205 pounds.


