
Thanks to all who made these things happen.

Gippsland Region Board summary

The Gippsland Region Board met on Monday 11 December at Bairnsdale Bowls Club.

The following is a summary of matters discussed and decisions made.

Conditions of Play

The Board noted there have been issues including:

- the interpretation of pennant rules for inclement weather
- entering of results in BowlsLink by the home team
- incorrect format of a club singles championship, resulting in the event being replayed
- at least one instance of a club ignoring the Weekend Pennant no break rule.

It agreed it is important that team managers understand their role, including how to apply the rules when required and how to enter results in BowlsLink. As such, it will ask the Competitions Committee to run team manager training sessions in both playing areas before the start of the next pennant season.

Gender

The Board noted with concern that some clubs may be at risk of breaching equal opportunity requirements by discriminating along gender lines in pennant selection. Clubs are reminded of the following clauses in the Bowls Victoria Regional Pennant Conditions of Play:

- Clause 4. Regions, in making decisions on gender-specific competitions and determining positions each gender may play, must ensure they are in line with equal opportunity requirements.
- Clause 12.1. Gender cannot be used as a criteria for selection.

Region Sides

The Board noted that the women's team to represent the Region in Ballarat in January has been finalised, with selection of the men's team to be completed later this week. Clubs will be notified about the full team once all selected players have been informed.

Other matters

- The Competitions Committee will be asked to consider a means of avoiding a cancellation of pennant as occurred on 2 December by including a double header in the Conditions of Play for season 2024/25 in such circumstances
- The State Fours final will played over 15 ends as in all lead up rounds.
- A date for the postponed Pairs finals has yet to be determined.

Here are just a couple of key Conditions of Play for which we should all be aware: CONDITIONS OF PLAY FOR GIPPSLAND PENNANT

6. Match commencement time

6.1. The normal commencement time will be 1.00pm for Weekend Pennant and 10.00am for Midweek Pennant. Commencement time can be brought forward by up to 30 minutes by agreement between side managers on the day of play.

Play will conclude 4 hours 15 minutes after commencement of play.

Total Fire Ban

11.2. All section East Pennant matches shall be abandoned when a Total Fire Ban has been declared for the East Gippsland Fire Ban district.

12.Inclement weather – Heat

- 12.2. Play cannot commence if:
 - *the temperature at the host club reaches 36 degrees Celsius at the scheduled commencement time of the match, play may be suspended for up to 1 hour.
 - Should the temperature fall below 36 degrees Celsius within one hour of play being suspended, play shall resume.
- 12.3. If the temperature fails to fall below 36 degrees Celsius within 1 hour of play being suspended, the match is abandoned.
- 12.4. If play has already commenced: Play will be suspended for up to 1 hour if the temperature at the host club reaches 36 degrees Celsius at any time after the start of play. If the temperature falls below 36 degrees Celsius within one hour of play being suspended, play shall resume.
- 12.5. The match will be abandoned if the temperature fails to fall below 36 degrees Celsius after play has been suspended for 1 hour.
- 12.6. Pennant matches which have been interrupted shall be abandoned after 4 hours and 15 minutes from the scheduled start time.
- 13.2. If play has commenced and the match is subsequently abandoned by mutual agreement between the side managers and the following minimum number of ends have been completed, 12 player side 48 ends 8 player side 32 ends the game will be awarded to the side which has the higher number of shots at the time the game is abandoned, and the points allocated according to condition 4 of the GBR Pennant competition COP.

21.Pre-Game Pennant Practice

- 21.2. Practice is permitted on the day of play on the rinks allocated for the match, for both the home and away sides.
- 21.3. Two rinks allocated for the match (one rink for 8 player sides) are to be made available for practice for the away side while one of the rinks is to be made available for the home side.
- 21.4. There is no restriction on how many or what rinks are used for practice outside of those rinks allocated for the match, so long as such use of other rinks does not limit the practice opportunity of other sides at the venue.
- 21.5. Practice for all sides must conclude thirty (30) minutes prior to the agreed commencement time of the game.

DO YOU KNOW THE LAWS OF THE GAME OF BOWLS?

Playing a game of Pennant and it is noticed, after the jack has been delivered, that the mat is on the wrong line. What happens next?

6 Placing the mat

6.1 At the start of each end

- 6.1.3 If, after the jack has been delivered but **before the first bowl is delivered**, a player or the marker finds that the mat line has not been positioned within the distances described in law 6.1.1, the opposing player must place the mat as described in law 6.1.1 and re-deliver the jack, making sure that it is centered, but the opposing player must not play first.
- 6.1.4 After the first player to play has delivered the first bowl, no-one has the right to challenge the legality of the original

Can you think of a situation where it is correct to put chalk on a bowl that has not actually touched the jack? If a player bowls a bowl, other than his own, and it comes to rest having touched the jack in the rink of play, it is replaced by a bowl from the proper set. The replacement bowl is chalked despite never itself having touched the jack.

This can also apply to a bowl which needs to be replaced after being damaged as a result of play, it is replaced by a bowl from the proper set and is chalked despite never itself having touched the jack.



We are now all in the Christmas break and look forward to strongly finishing off the remainder of the Pennant season.








