

### MANAGER'S REPORT - JULY 2025 Jeff Graham

Hello all,

I'd like to start with some important information regarding my role as General Manager.

Other than the above, not a great deal to report over the past month.

Last Committee of Management meeting I proposed to reduce my hours and salary to that of a part time position. Specifically, I intend on working four days per week, Tuesday to Friday and dropping my Saturday Golf Shop shift. This will both save the club a small amount of money but more importantly allow myself and Leonie more time to enjoy the things we love. I have assured the Committee that this will not impact my ability to manage the club, the Saturday shift was entirely service related and I performed very little management tasks. Whilst the details are yet to be finalised its 99% likely to commence in October and to say I'm looking forward to it is an understatement. Who knows, I may play golf Saturdays!

Next month, I shall be detailing a strategy to raise some extra revenue which includes the return of the meals nights, the café expansion, social events and more.

### Strategic Plan update.

#### **IN PROGRESS**

(Perform 50% of) Change the sand in seven bunkers. Repair the drainage and change the sand in four others, fill in and grass two others.

In accordance with our Bunker audit, we will be fully renovating the 1<sup>st</sup> hole left greenside. The 17<sup>th</sup> hole left greenside, 8<sup>th</sup> hole front right greenside. We will also replace the sand in the 2<sup>nd</sup> hole, 3<sup>rd</sup> hole x 2, 5<sup>th</sup> hole, 8<sup>th</sup> hole and 14<sup>th</sup> hole. NO UPDATE since last report **Perform minor renovations to the female change rooms.** Finance has approved the flooring replacement, when Wood St Style and Flooring are available, it will be replaced. UPDATE: The flooring in the cubicle has been installed. Next, we will attack the vanities and the floor directly in front of them. NO UPDATE since last month's report however some correspondence with the Wednesday committee of the allocation of funds and timing of the works has started.

UPDATE: We have engaged contractors to provide us with advice relating to the construction of a <u>permanent</u> pathway from the 18<sup>th</sup> green to the club house (with a 10<sup>th</sup> tee connection) COM are currently weighing up the associated costs. We expect to reconstruct the pathway in the Next two months, whether it be hex grid/crushed rock, concrete, asphalt or similar remains to be determined.



## **Gippsland Region Board summary**



The Gippsland Region Board met on Monday 14 July. The following is a summary of matters discussed, and decisions made.

#### Payment gateway

Clubs are advised that a GBR payment gateway has been established on BowlsLink to enable competitors to pay fees via credit or debit card when they enter State and Region events. The initiative will streamline payments and eliminate the need for

host clubs to collect fees on the first day of play.

The first event in 2025/26 is the State Fours on 11 and 12 October. Clubs interested in hosting a State and/or Region event are reminded to submit an EOI by 19 September.

#### Governance

The Board formally accepted the resignation of Marg Brandhoj as a director, recognising Marg's excellent contribution during her tenure since the amalgamation of the two divisions in 2021.

#### **Pennant**

The Board noted that the 2025/26 Weekend and Midweek pennant structures are close to being finalised, with clubs still having time to enter a side to fill vacancies. It supported a proposal that teams finishing on top of their division at the conclusion of the home and away rounds will be awarded a home semifinal.

#### Live scoring training

Clubs are again reminded about the live scoring training to be held at Maffra and Bairnsdale bowls clubs on Saturday 9 and Sunday 10 August respectively. Open to all members, the workshops are particularly important for Premier League and Division 1 Midweek clubs for which live scoring will be mandatory.

#### Junior development

The Board endorsed a proposal from Nigel Plunkett and Wendy Campbell for a change in the way junior development is undertaken in the Region. The change recognises the lack of junior recruitment by most clubs and some resistance to travelling to junior development squad (JDS) training at Bairnsdale Bowls Club on Saturday mornings (1st and 3rd).

### The changes are:

suspension of Saturday training until there is an U18 tournament; as JDS coaches, Nigel and Wendy making themselves available to attend any session organised by clubs for their juniors; Nigel and Wendy making themselves available to coach any individual or group of U18 bowlers at a mutually suitable time.

#### Communications protocols

The Board discussed the issue of confidentiality, confirming the importance of its committees (Competitions, Region Sides Selection and Disciplinary) always maintaining confidentiality during deliberations about matters for which they are responsible. It approved a proposal to create clear communication protocols to ensure committee integrity is upheld and prevent clubs from receiving mixed messages or misinformation.

#### Strategic Plan

The Board will hold a preliminary strategic plan workshop in August, to be facilitated by Bowls Victoria Southern Regional Manager, Mark Coleman.





### **ETIQUETTE**

- It is good etiquette to hand your opponent the jack and their bowl after they have placed the mat to commence play.
- The first job of the Lead whose team won the previous end is to place the mat. This helps the others to know how far to kick back the bowls. The Lead should have the mat ready to be placed as soon as the head is declared in social bowls, to prevent a lot of kicking, the mat can be placed in front of the majority of the head.
- Pay your skip the respect of waiting for directions, don't make up your mind what shot to play.
- Show respect for every opponent you play by not moving about while they are on the mat, or making noise while they are about to deliver a bowl.
- When an opponent is on the mat they have control of the rink and opposing players should not walk up the green obstructing their view whilst their bowl is still running.
- Never applaud lucky shots, never complain about lucky shots, and admit a lucky shot with good grace.
- At the completion of the game, it is the role of the Lead to return mats and jacks to the storage area.





Leads should be ready with the mat as soon as the end is declared.

Quickly place the mat in the required position so all the players know how far to kick the bowls back.

Please vary positioning of the mat to share the wear on the green.

The mat can be placed anywhere as long as the jack is a minimum 21 metres.

The space between the lines on our greens is 21 metres so it should be easy to gauge the legal length.

The mat does not have to be on the line. Everyone should learn to bowl without a line. More than likely it will happen in Pennant and you should be ready for it.
