# COURSE MANAGEMENT REPORT - OCTOBER 2019

**Craig Rimington**

October has been very busy for the Course Staff, and with commencement of both Midweek and Saturday Pennant Bowls. We have also been busy prepping the Golf Course for the Annual Golf Week in late Oct. early Nov. Strong winds have been quite frustrating this month continually making messy debris to clean up.

Course Management Practices undertaken during October have included preparations for day to day running of all Club events golf and bowls; fertiliser applications Couch grass surfaces; IPM spray management programs and general course maintenance practices.

### Greens

Golf greens were sand dusted, and soil amendments added early in October. We have continued the monthly verti-draining, and are up to date with the spray applications. November will see us get back into our Poa control for the golf greens.

We plan a trial to core the putting green with "pencil tynes" which will remove organic matter. These tynes are extremely small and we will look at this process to potentially move out to the course greens.

### Bowling Greens

Both Bowls greens have been liquid fertilized. Both greens have been rolling very well around 14 -15 sec when prepared for events. Preparations are underway for the top green renovation in December. Both greens will be solid tyne aerated later this month leading into the renovation early December.

### Tees

Divoting of tees has been on a fortnightly or as needs basis. Tees have been liquid and granular fertilized and will be treated with insecticide for Couch mite control during November.

### Fairways

General maintenance has taken place for the month, we have applied a dry blend Calcium/ Magnesium product to help with soil pH corrections, this will help correct deficiencies and unlock unavailable nutrients in the soil.

We plan to scarify selected fairways to harvest Couch sprigs possibly around the end of November.

We are looking for optimum weather to achieve the best fastest results with the Couch planting and for fairway recovery, currently with the extreme variances with the weather we are happy to keep waiting.

### Bunkers

General bunker maintenance has taken place including; sand levelling and addition, weed control and edging.

### Vegetation

General clean- up of fallen limbs, branches, leaf litter.

### Machinery

Scheduled maintenance is being carried out on all machinery as required.


### Works Program for November 2019 to include:-



After presentations Mary McAuley was awarded her hole-in-one trophy which she won at the 8<sup>th</sup> hole on September 8<sup>th</sup>.



On the last Sunday of the month, October 27<sup>th</sup> a Par event was played by 62 men and women.



## HISTORY

### Ron Healey - Club Historian



#### EXCERPTS FROM MINUTE BOOK COMPRISING 349 PAGES DATING FROM 6<sup>TH</sup> MARCH, 1947 TO 12<sup>TH</sup> SEPTEMBER 1957.

The next **meeting** of interest was **June 12, 1951** items were discussed relating to the upcoming tournament with a further item relating to work on the Associates dressing room. A new window was to be installed and the existing one attended to. A downpipe was to be fixed to the wash basin. (I don't know whether this was to put water in or drain it out). A motion was moved that a special general meeting be called on June 29 to hear the recommendations of the Special Committee on the New Course.

A further 13 new members were inducted at this meeting and amongst the names was a B. Savage (I presume this is Bruce although the correct spelling is Savige).

**Special General Meeting June 29, 1951** Chair of the sub-committee Mr Bayley reported the recommendation that the new course land be sold.

Considerable discussion took place and a motion was moved by Mr Holloway that a decision on "Clifton" be deferred until a full report be received from a Sub Committee consisting of Mr R H Archibald (Pres) Messrs Bayley, Morecroft, Jackson & Holman in regard to the purchase of another site under offer, with a further Special Meeting to be called within 1 month.

At the **meeting July 13, 1951** Mr. Bayley moved that a Special General Meeting be called on July 28 to discuss their report on the proposed 'New' course site and also discussions with the adjoining owners of the Clifton Creek site for repairing of fences.

**Special General Meeting July 28, 1951** 25 members in attendance, Mr Bayley reported on the proposed new course. He advised that the special committee were not in favour of the site and recommended that the offer of the land be declined. This recommendation was carried.

(An item in the AGM Minutes 24/2/52 mentioned a letter of thanks and a cheque for seven guineas be forwarded to Mr F Morecroft for his services rendered in the inspection of the proposed new course at **Bengworden**, I can only presume that this is the site they declined).

A motion was then moved that the Clifton Creek property be sold at auction with a reserve of five hundred pounds.

An amendment was moved that the reserve be One Pound per acre. This amendment was defeated. The original motion was then withdrawn.

Mr E E Coate moved a new motion that no action be taken as regards to the Clifton property, an amendment was moved that the Clifton property be auctioned with a reserve of two pounds ten shillings per acre, the amendment was defeated.

Mr. Coate's motion was then put and carried. (Must have been a frustrating meeting)

A next meeting was a short one held **28<sup>th</sup> September 1951** generally discussing the success of the Club Tournament and the profit of 330 pounds.

The following meeting was a **Special General Meeting February 22, 1952**, at this meeting attended by 23 members a letter from Messrs Grant & Bayley was read submitting an offer of 500 pounds clear of commission on behalf of Mr K. Black. The matter was subject to lengthy discussion but the motion that the offer of Mr Black be accepted was carried unanimously. The Trustee was instructed to transfer the property.

Without the Clifton property to argue about future meetings will become somewhat mundane.


