Strategic Plan update.

IN PROGRESS

Clubhouse Lounge Ceiling. UPDATE This was scheduled for July 2025 and we commenced the process at that point in time. Our pro-bono plasterer has engaged another contractor to assist and unfortunately it appears this will be a considerably bigger job than first thought (and quoted). The entire ceiling will need to be removed (rather than covered with new board). We are currently obtaining quotes.

MANAGER'S REPORT - SEPTEMBER 2025 (cont.)

Change the sand in seven bunkers. Repair the drainage and change the sand in four others, fill in and grass two others. (Perform 50% of).

In accordance with our Bunker audit, we will be fully renovating the 1st hole left greenside. The 17th hole left greenside, 8th hole front right greenside. We will also replace the sand in the 2nd hole, 3rd hole x 2, 5th hole, 8th hole and 14th hole. NO UPDATE since last report.

Perform minor renovations to the female change rooms. Finance has approved the flooring replacement, when Wood St Style and Flooring are available, it will be replaced. UPDATE: The flooring in the cubicle has been installed. Next, we will attack the vanities and the floor directly in front of them. NO UPDATE since last month's report however some correspondence with the Wednesday committee of the allocation of funds and timing of the works has started.

IF TIME PERMITS

(Perform 50% of) Repair or reconstruct the golf course paths rated a high priority. 5^{th} to 6^{th} , 6^{th} to 7^{th} , 7^{th} to 8^{th} & 10^{th} to 11^{th} . UPDATE: Unfortunately, due to the limited staff

resources on the course we will not be in a position to start the path reconstructions.

UPDATE: We are back to full strength with course staff levels. Throughout the next 6 months we hope to catch-up on the above high priority bunker works. Unfortunately, we are back to two staff for the short term which will delay the process a month or so. UPDATE: From the week of Monday July 7th we will be back to full strength and whilst there will be a staff training period we will hopefully get to the paths over winter. UPDATE: We have engaged contractors to provide us with advice relating to the construction of a <u>permanent</u> pathway from the 18th green to the clubhouse (with a 10th tee connection) COM are currently weighing up the associated costs.

We expect to reconstruct the pathway in the next two months, whether it be hex grid/crushed rock, concrete, asphalt or similar remains to be determined. UPDATE: COM have approved the construction of a hex grid pathway with concrete culvert drainage from the clubhouse to the 18th green (via a new cutaway through the garden bed to the front of the 18th green (and onwards to the women's 10th tee. We expect this to commence within the month (contractor dependent for the culvert drain).

- Otherwise, our expenses are tracking well.


Net Profit (Before Depreciation) is over \$3,100 (good).



COURSE MANAGEMENT - SEPTEMBER 2025 Craig Rimington

September has been exceptionally dry and windy only recording 9mm rain.

The start of the month had seen us host the Dale CADD Associates Pro – Am.

Mid-month had seen us undertake greens renovations. Greens were hollow tined with 8mm tines, cores collected, greens cleaned, amendments applied, around thirty-two

tonnes of sand applied, rubbed and brushed in.

We now prepare for the upcoming Annual Tournament, mid-October and the start of the Bowls Club and Pennant season.

Course Management Practices undertaken during September have included: -

Preparations for day to day running of all Club events Golf & Bowls; greens aeration 8mm hollow tine; conclusion of vegetation works as per tree audit; IPM spray management programs; weed control, bunkers, and tee surrounds; machinery maintenance and general course maintenance practices.

Greens

Greens have been 8mm hollow tine aerated, granular amendments and fertilizer applied. Greens have been treated with liquid fertilizer, wetting agent, preventative fungicide and insecticide applications. A Grooming/Verti cutting, and sand dusting program will commence late October. We will re-commence the second season of Couch/Kikuyu grass encroachment spraying.

Bowling Greens

Both greens have been treated with multiple fungicides for ERI and BF1 – (Fairway patch), greens have been fertilized, liquid inoculants applied and 1st application of wetting agent.

The bottom green renovation will take place after the Ladies invitational event.

Tees

Divoting tees has been on a fortnightly or as needs basis. Tees have been sprayed for Black beetles and early season application of miticide has been applied to minimize mite damage. Tees will be liquid and granular fertilized during October.

Heavy sand topdressing of select tees to take place.

Fairways

Fairways, general maintenance has taken place for the month, Fertilizer, Miticide, Growth Regulator and Herbicide applications will take place during October, as the Herbicide products used can be highly mobile with foot traffic spraying of these products will require closure of holes to complete. We aim to complete spraying in suitable weather and plan for Monday and Wednesday afternoons.

Weed spraying in Roughs and out of play areas are underway.

Bunkers

General maintenance, weed spraying, leaf litter removal.

Vegetation

Completion of Tree works for this period (13 weeks), completed High risk trees, stump grinding and clean up.

STAFF/OH&S

Create/ add/ update E – Par WHS system, staff training compliance.

Path repairs (crushed rock); machinery maintenance; IPM Control Program; Couch/Kikuyu grass encroachment herbicide spraying applications.

ANOTHER PAGE FROM THE REPORTS THAT BEV YEATES HAS PROVIDED FROM HER SEARCHING THROUGH 'TROVE'. THIS COVERS THE AGM'S 1932 & 1933.

The AGM for 1932 was held on a Wednesday night in March at the Soldiers' Club rooms.

The Annual Report and Balance Sheet which were previously published in the Advertiser were adopted on the motion of the Chairman and Mr. R. Brownlow.

In answer to enquiries the Chairman said that the falling off in receipts as compared with those of the previous year was due to £60 less being received from the Tournament.

In 1930 the receipts were much larger than usual due to the Gippsland Championships being contested at Bairnsdale that year. The other reason for the fall off was that subscriptions were down by £20.

Dr Alsop pointed out that last year the <u>Club had been put to a heavy expense on account of the abnormal growth of grass on the links</u>, and under the circumstances they had done well to show a profit of £30.

The Subscriptions were fixed at the same rated as last year. Some discussions were held to reduce the age of Junior members to 18 years, but it was decided that it should remain at 20. It was also suggested that the Annual Subscription be fixed at £2/2/-, with the Committee be empowered to make a levy of 10/6 if necessary.

This proposal was also defeated, members expressing the view that as the Club was showing a profit no attempt should be made to increase the members fees, although it was admitted that desirable improvement could be made with additional revenue.

The general opinion was that any increase in membership fees would react against the interests of the Club under the prevailing financial conditions.

(I am not quite old enough to remember it, but the early thirties were the years of the Great Depression with unemployment at around 30%).

Opening day was fixed for March 19, It was decided to play a mixed foursomes (Choose partners and choose opponents). Trophies will be donated by the President and members will be entertained at afternoon tea by the President's wife.

Votes of thanks were passed to Mr Bert Morecroft for his services as greenkeeper, Club members were extremely grateful for the excellent attention he gave to the greens. Also, the ladies were thanked for providing afternoon teas at the Tournament.

The AGM for 1933 was held at the Soldiers' Club rooms in March on a Wednesday evening. The President Mr E.M. Morrison presided.

The Annual Report disclosed a very satisfactory state of affairs.

HISTORY (cont.)

Once again, the report stated, we are able to congratulate members on another successful year. There was an increase of 12 in the number of Members to 98 but the Associate membership decreased by 5 to 90.

The Balance Sheet shows a difference of £27/1/5, between receipts and expenditure, thereby reducing the overdraft at the National Bank. The expenditure was £191/13/9 for the year on wages, being an increase of £39/1/- on the previous year, the Committee purchased a new Horse mower at a cost of £30/5/3, (boy some bargaining went on there), and a spiked roller £13/7/6, which are doing excellent work. (The major fuel cost was chaff in those days).

Though the achievements of members in the Royal and Ancient game were not so successful as in previous years, a high standard of golf was maintained. With so many promising young players coming on, prospects for the future look exceedingly bright.

The Club Championship was won by Mr Len Morecroft, with Mr Roy Potter runner up. Presided over by Mrs. S. Brownlow and with Miss P. Jackson as Secretary the Associates again had a successful year. They cannot be too highly praised for the manner in which they assisted throughout the year.

The Associate Championship was won by Mrs. W.P. Heath with Miss M. Nixon runner-up. Mrs. W.P. Heath proved the standard of Gippsland's Associate golf when she was runner-up in the Associate's Country Championship of Victoria.

During the coming season your Committee hopes to sand bunker the course and erect new tees which should greatly improve it.
