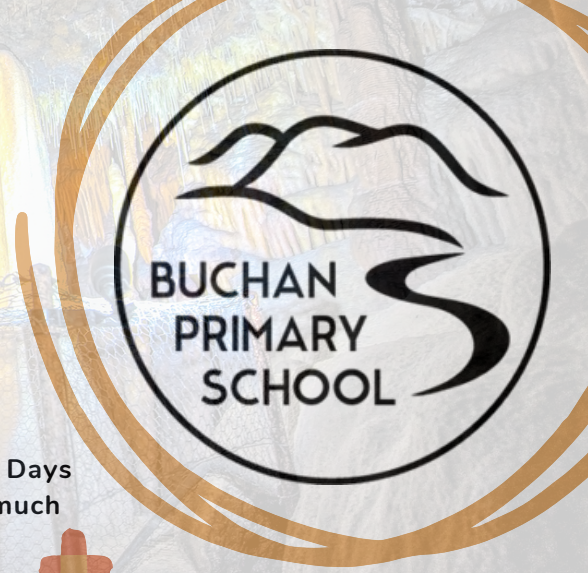

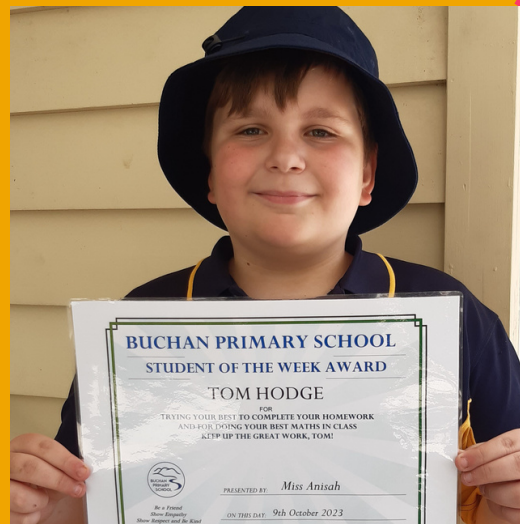


OLIVIA MATHERS

For trying your best to complete your homework and for doing your best maths in class. Keep up the great work, Tom!

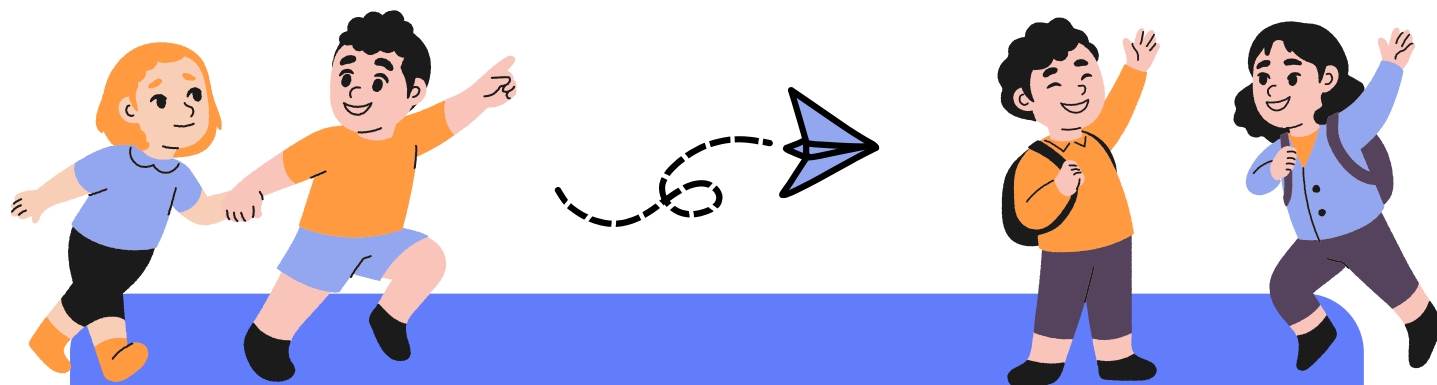


District Cricket

EVENT DETAILS

WHEN: Saturday 21st October, 2023 - from 10:00am - 2:00 pm

Arrival and Setting Up

Time	Details
7.30 am Due to flagging tape being used on day to cordon off pedestrian walkways, vehicles will not be permitted in event area after 9.00 am.	NO public access to the event during this time. Stallholders can access the venue from 7.30 am. Event coordinator will be on site to direct stallholders to their site locations. Venue set up details will be emailed to stallholders prior to the day, and location details will be marked at the venue on the day.
10.00 am - 2.00 pm	Event open to public. All stallholders MUST be set up by 10.00 am, however vehicles will not be permitted in the site area after 9.00 am. Stallholders are expected to stay for the full duration of the event.
2.15 pm	End of Event. Stallholders are expected to remain for the duration of the event and not begin pack down until after the event's end time.

EVENT VALUES

The Children's Week National Theme for 2023 is based on **UNCRC Article 31: Children have the right to relax, play and take part in activities they enjoy.**

The Children's Week Committee is committed to safety, participation and empowerment of all families. This includes:

- Treating all children with respect and dignity at all times.
- Ensuring environments are culturally safe and inclusive to all children, specifically:
 - Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander children;
 - Children from culturally and linguistically diverse backgrounds; and
 - Children with disabilities.
- Ensuring all interactions with children are respectful.

We wish for this event to be fun and inclusive for the children and families living in our community, and invite you to design a stall and/or activity that supports their needs and engages their interests.

SAFETY

Public Liability Insurance

All stallholders must have their own Public Liability & Professional Indemnity Insurance (valued at \$10 million). The venue's insurance does not cover stallholders or their products/displays.

Risk Assessments

All stallholders must have completed a risk assessment relating to their stall. Whilst a general risk assessment will be completed, it will not consider the risks associated with individual stalls and/or activities.

Working with Children Check

As part of this event's child safeguarding and compliance measures, it is expected that all stallholders and their employees/volunteers have a current Working with Children Check.



ADDITIONAL DETAILS

QUIET SPACE

A comfortable area will be available for children and/or adults needing a quiet place. This will be set up in the Squash Centre.

TABLES & CHAIRS

Please bring your own tables, chairs and any other items that are needed for your stall.

ELECTRICAL EQUIPMENT

There will be no power available at the venue. Any personal electrical equipment that is used at the event must have a valid test and tag label.

SET UP

OUTDOOR SET UP

Be aware that if you have an outdoor stall, you may be positioned on a gravel or grassed surface. Please prepare accordingly to be able to adequately secure any shade or other equipment. Protection from the weather (sun, rain, wind, storm, etc.) cannot be guaranteed. If the weather becomes hazardous, the event staff will put the emergency management plan in action (which will be shared with stallholders prior to event).

INDOOR SET UP

The indoor exhibition area has a 'sensitive' floor surface. No adhesive tape or metal furniture (including table and chair legs) of any kind are to be used on the surface.

Please note: Food, drinks, bubbles, and other liquids are not permitted inside the building.
