JUNIOR CLASSROOM

Our junior students have been exploring numeracy through hands-on activities focused on shapes, edges, vertices, and faces. They've also been making great progress in literacy, with our Foundation students beginning Grade 1 systematic synthetic phonics. They are learning different ways to spell the long /a/ sound, such as ai (rain), ay (play), and a_e (lake). Older students have been delving into morphology, exploring prefixes, bases, and suffixes. For example, the base spir, meaning "to breathe life into something", this allows them to build words like inspired.

It was wonderful for all of our Grade 5/6 students to visit the Buchan Caves Reserve with Bruthen Primary School and take part in a range of enjoyable sporting activities, including dodgeball. These valuable experiences are vital for building strong future friendships and lasting positive relationships as students successfully transition into Secondary School.

Update on Digital Device Use in Primary Schools

The Victorian Government has announced upcoming changes to the use of digital devices for students from Prep to Grade 6, beginning in 2027.

Under the new guidelines:

- Schools will no longer invite families to purchase or bring their own digital devices for use at school.
- There will be recommended limits on device time, with minimal use for Prep to Grade 2, and a maximum of 90 minutes per day for students in Grades 3 to 6.

These changes aim to support families by reducing cost-of-living pressures, while also promoting student wellbeing through reduced screen time. Less time on devices can help prevent eye strain, sedentary behaviour, and encourage greater peer interaction. The reforms complement Victoria's nation-leading mobile phone restrictions, creating a more balanced and focused learning environment.

At Buchan Primary School, we are proud to share that our current Digital Device Policy already aligns with these new recommendations. All student learning is supported using school-owned devices, and our existing practice ensures very limited device use:

- Junior students currently have very minimal device time.
- Senior students use devices well below the 90-minute daily maximum.

These practices reflect our ongoing commitment to providing a balanced and engaging learning experience, where technology is used purposefully to enhance, not dominate, classroom learning and ensuring digital literacy is still developed.

Buchan Primary School is committed to providing a safe and respectful learning environment wh bullying will not be tolerated

- Explain the definition of bullying so that there is shared understanding amongst all members of the Buchan Primary School community
- Make clear that no form of bullying at Buchan Primary School will be tolerated. . Outline the strategies and programs in place at Buchan Primary School to build a positive
- school culture and prevent bullying behaviour · Ask that everyone in our school community be alert to signs and evidence of bullying behaviour, and understands the importance of reporting bullying behaviour to school staff
- Ensure that all reported incidents of bullying are appropriately investigated and addressed
- . Ensure that support is provided to students who may be affected by bullying behaviour (including targets, bystanders, witnesses and students engaging in bullying behaviour)
- Seek parental and peer group support in addressing and preventing bullying behaviour at **Buchan Primary School**

When responding to bullying behaviour, Buchan Primary School aims to:

- . Be proportionate, consistent and responsive
- Find a constructive solution for everyone
- Stop the bullying from happening again · Restore the relationships between the students involved.

Buchan Primary School acknowledges that school staff owe a duty of care to students to take reasonable steps to reduce the risk of reasonably foreseeable harm, which can include harm that may be caused by bullying behaviour

This policy addresses how Buchan Primary School aims to prevent, address and respond to student bullying behaviour. Buchan Primary School recognises that there are many other types of inappropriate student behaviours that do not meet the definition of bullying which are also

School preparations for the bushfire season

Each year, we undertake a range of activities to ensure the safety of our school and to prepare for bushfires and grassfires.

An important part of this process is communicating to parents what will happen when certain fire danger ratings are issued to help ensure the safety of students and staff.



Our school has been identified as being at risk of bushfire or grassfire and is a Category 3 school.

Our school will **close** on a day forecasted as **Catastrophic fire danger rating** in the **East Gippsland fire district**.

Closure of the school due to a Catastrophic fire danger rating will be enacted when the Bureau of Meteorology forecast and related public safety messaging are confirmed. Due to uncertainties in the forecast, the timing of this confirmation may vary. Information regarding potential or confirmed Catastrophic fire danger days will be communicated to you by School Stream.

It is also important to be aware that:

- No one will be on site on days where the school is closed due to a forecast Catastrophic day.
- All bus routes that travel through the Catastrophic area will be cancelled.
- School camps will be cancelled if a Catastrophic fire danger rating day is forecast for fire
 weather district in which the camp is located, or if the travel involves passing through areas
 that have Catastrophic fire danger.

As part of preparing our school for the fire season, we have updated and completed our Emergency Management Plan and completed bushfire preparedness activities.

What can families and the school community do to help us prepare?

- Ensure we have your current contact details, including your mobile phone numbers.
- Keep in touch with us by checking School Stream regularly, reading the school newsletter, checking our website and talking to any member of the teaching staff about our emergency management plan.
- Make sure your family's bushfire survival plan is up-to-date and includes alternative care arrangements if our school is closed due to Catastrophic fire danger. Further information can be found on the <u>CFA's website</u>.
- Action your family's bushfire survival plan if your own triggers are met. Our school
 community may be spread out across many areas and some families may be at higher risk
 than others. Your family's safety is critical, so please let us know if you are actioning your
 bushfire survival plan and if your children will be absent on these days.
- If your child is old enough, talk to <u>them about bushfires</u> and your family's bushfire survival plan.



Families are encouraged to action their <u>Bushfire Survival Plan</u> on Catastrophic fire danger rating days in their district. The safest option is to leave the night before or early on the morning of the Catastrophic day. **On such days, children should never be left at home alone or in the care of older children.**

Frequently Asked Questions

What is the department's policy?

The Department of Education annually assesses the fire risk of all schools and early childhood services with the support of the Commonwealth Scientific and Industrial Research Organisation (CSIRO). They are allocated a category of risk (categories 0 to 6). Schools and services that are Categories 0-3 are published on the <u>Bushfire At-Risk Register (BARR)</u>. Schools at some risk of bushfire and grassfire are published on the <u>Category 4 List</u>.

The department's <u>Bushfire and Grassfire Preparedness Policy</u> requires all schools and early childhood services on the BARR and the Category 4 List to close when a Catastrophic fire danger rating day is forecast in their fire weather district. All school bus routes which travel in or through a district with Catastrophic fire danger must also be cancelled.


The policy also requires that schools at the highest risk of bushfire (those in Categories 0, 1 and 2 of the Bushfire At-Risk Register) enact pre-emptive action plans based on the fire danger forecast for their Local Government Area (LGA).

Who issues fire danger forecasts?

The Bureau of Meteorology (BoM) provides public fire danger rating forecasts each day of the fire danger period using fire weather district areas. In Victoria, there are 9 fire weather districts, which are based on Local Government Area boundaries.

The department uses these forecasts when supporting schools to enact their pre-emptive bushfire actions plans.
