It was terrific to see all students involved in structured lessons and learning valuable water safety skills whilst growing in confident being in the water. -New COVID-19 Changes to Regulations—Changes have been made regarding how COVID-19 is managed in schools. The isolation requirements are now recommendations instead of mandatory requirements. For staff and students who want to wear face masks going forward, will be able to continue to do so. The Victorian Government has announced the end of the Pandemic Declaration and associated Pandemic Orders. The following settings, based on advice form the Department of Health, will apply from 11.59pm Wednesday 12th October 2022.

It is strongly recommended that students and/or staff:

- who test positive to COVID-19 stay home and isolate for 5 days.
- Should not attend school after 5 days if still symptomatic.
- Who are symptomatic but have not tested positive should not attend school.
- Advise the school of the COVID-19 positive test results.

Where students and /or staff become symptomatic at school they should:

- be collected by their parents / carers
- Undergo testing for COVID-19.

-SRC (Student Representative Council) — The whole school is involved in a junior school council meeting as part of student voice and agency as it relates to school in general. This report is presented alongside the principal report to school councillors. They raised the following suggestions:




