This means our school will be closed and unstaffed on Code Red Days as well as other days deemed unsafe. Families will be given as much warning as possible. Safety is our first priority.




Junior Classroom

Last week I was privileged to attend the government Principal's Conference at the Melbourne Convention and Exhibition Centre in the CBD. There were many themes covered including student wellbeing, staff wellbeing, leading schools and cultural inclusion. The following day I was at the Victorian Academy of Teaching & Learning in Moe completing finance & management training. Thank you to Miss Julian, Mrs Earle and Mrs Nowell for holding down the fort at school over those 2 days.

Each year we publish our Annual Report to the School Community. This report outlines 2022 and reflects on the school's performance and explains the impact of school improvement efforts on student outcomes. The report contains results of various surveys and assessments, such as NAPLAN data and the student, staff and family surveys. This report will be published on our school website next Friday, after being shared at School Council on the Monday. I highly encourage families to have a look when made available next week. There are lots of celebrations within the report, which reflect what a strong community we have. Some highlights were our school climate (staff survey) being 25% higher than the state average and Grade 4-6 students sense of contentedness to the school being 100%, the strongest in our network and 20% higher than the state average.

Our Semester One Student Reports will be available on the 23rd of June. These reports will be printed out and given to students. Please take the time to look through them with your child and celebrate their achievements this semester. Andrew Kenyon wrote the senior class reports and I wrote the junior class reports.

We welcome back Miss Julian for Term 3. Hannah will continue to teach the senior classroom next term. While holidays are still a week away, this will be the final newsletter for Term 2. It has certainly absolutely flown past and I hope everyone has a great holiday!


