THE BUCHAN FAIRY CAVES

The school went to the fairy cave for a free tour courtesy of our principal Mrs Walker. The journey there was on foot which was a good idea seeing that we all needed to stretch our legs because we had to spend about an hour standing in the cave.

When we got there we had a chance to go to the toilet, have a snack, drink and play on the Frank Moon playground. My favourite things to play on were the swings and the monkey bars. The walk to the Fairy Cave took about 5 minutes to get to the briefing area. This session will give you a chance to talk with our guest speaker about challenges you may be experiencing, ask questions and learn from the experience of others.


