JUNIOR CLASSROOM

Fables and Stories:

Junior students have been learning about fables as part of their literacy block, which are short stories (often with animals acting like people) that teach a lesson, called a moral. Students have been listening to and discussing classic fables such as The Boy Who Cried Wolf and The Goose and the Golden Eggs. They have been identifying key features of fables, noticing that they are usually short, often include personification (animals behaving like humans), and finish with a clear message or moral. Through these texts, students have been developing their comprehension skills by exploring characters, setting and plot, retelling stories in their own words, and discussing the lesson each story teaches.



SENIOR CLASSROOM

School Captain Speeches: Our Grade 6 students have begun preparing their School Captain speeches, taking time to reflect deeply on what makes an effective and inspiring leader. As part of this process, they have explored a range of leadership qualities and dispositions, discussing how strong leaders demonstrate responsibility, integrity, empathy, and the ability to listen to others.

Mathematics: Our senior students have also been developing their understanding of integers in Mathematics. Integers are whole numbers that can be positive, negative, or zero. They help students make sense of quantities in real-life contexts such as temperature above and below zero, elevations, financial gains and losses, and scoring in games.

NAPLAN

NAPLAN is the National Assessment Program for Literacy and Numeracy, undertaken annually by students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 across Australia. It assesses key skills in reading, writing, language conventions and numeracy that students develop through the Australian Curriculum. This year, NAPLAN will be held from Wednesday the 11th of March through to Monday the 23rd of March. Schools schedule the assessments within this testing window, generally prioritising the earlier days where possible.

Stop Work Action:

A 24-hour Australian Education Union (AEU) Stop Work Day of Action will take place on Tuesday, 24th of March. We will provide further updates closer to the date regarding any impact this may have on your child's school day. We kindly ask that our school community remain mindful and respectful to any staff who choose to participate in this action.

Art



In art this week, junior students created self-portraits, carefully drawing their faces and features while practising observation, proportions, and adding personal details to represent themselves.

Senior students explored identity in Art by creating segmented self-portrait drawings, using symbols, patterns and simple illustrations to represent their interests, personality, and experiences while practising line work, composition, and creative expression.

Sounds-Write

For 30 minutes each day, as part of their two-hour literacy block, Foundation students have been participating in the Sounds-Write program. In these first few weeks, they have focused on learning the sounds s, a, t, i, and m. They are beginning to recognise these sounds in words and practise blending them together to read simple consonant–vowel–consonant (CVC) words. This week, they are learning the sounds n, o and p.

The remainder of the literacy block is spent developing students' oral language, fine motor skills, phonological awareness, practising handwriting and early writing skills, and listening to and discussing fables.



SCHOOL COUNCIL

Buchan Primary School has opened nominations for School Council, this will close next week on the 27th of February, we would love to see some new faces on school council. STUDENT OF THE WEEK




OLIVER
