

World Harmony Day

Students celebrated World Harmony Day on Tuesday the 21st of March. World Harmony Week is a celebration that recognises our diversity and brings together Australians from all different backgrounds. The week is about inclusiveness, respect and a sense of belonging for everyone. Students showed their participation and support through wearing orange and immersing themselves in a wide variety of activities on Tuesday.

Both the senior and junior students spent the morning session together learning about what Harmony Week is and why it is celebrated. Senior and junior students then paired up together and completed a fun and engaging Kahoot (quiz) on the information they had just learnt. Both classes then completed a mural together, each student was given a cube and they were required to draw a pattern that signified harmony in orange on the top part of the cube. The left hand side of the cube was a word, feeling or a thought that students associated with harmony and the right hand side represented something cultural or traditional.

In the final block, junior students completed another fun craft activity in the art room. Students coloured in a picture that represented unity and put their handprint in the center. These were then cut onto orange paper and students wrote a sentence or paragraph about what Harmony Day is.
