CLIFTON CREEK PRIMARY SCHOOL EXCURSION

Throughout the year, Sue Paul (Principal of Clifton Creek PS) and I have worked together to create learning, friendship and transition opportunities for our students by engaging them in whole school excursions at Clifton Creek PS. Our aim was to organise one excursion per term to enable both schools to meet and make new friends and work with other students in different learning context.

SCHOOLWIDE POSITIVE BEHAVIOUR SUPPORT

The school was successful in signing up with the DET (Department Education Training) to provide the school with 10 sessions per year of intensive coaching with a SWPBS coach until December 2024. Staff will have access to the SWPBS Resources Hub and complete online blended professional learning and develop and follow an action plan for SWPBS implementation and report on progress. They will also collect baseline academic data and behaviour data too so that we can review exiting discipline, academic and school data.

TRANSITIONING TO 2023

We will be introducing a 2 day transition experience towards the end of December. On Monday 12th and Tuesday 13th December, all students will transition to their next grade level. For students attending Bairnsdale Secondary College, they will transition to Year 7 on Tuesday 13th December. For students who are attending Nagle College, they will transition to Year 7 on Tuesday 29th November. On the day/s that these students are at school, they will be working on their graduation and end of year activities and assisting in the classrooms as required.

DATA TRACKER

The school is looking at introducing a new data tracker this term to assist staff in tracking student learning growth. This tool will allow staff to analyse data and identify current student performance, long term school trends and look at how much 'value added learning' is happening at our school. This tool will benefit staff and students in 2023, as it will provide our staff with a more detailed picture of what supports and strategies we need to put in place for each student prior to them starting school next year. It will also assist staff at the end of the year with student handover when staff have conversations about the students in their class and they have access to all of the data in the one place.


