

### Parent-Opinion Survey:

We value your voice and want to hear your thoughts! The Department of Education is once again running the annual Parent / Caregiver / Guardian Opinion Survey. This survey helps us better understand your perceptions of our school including areas such as school climate, student engagement, and student behavior. Currently participation in the survey is fairly poor, at only 27%, after being above 70%+ last year. We are hoping to get many more responses before the survey ends. ### **Emergency Management Plans:**

Each year in September, all Victorian schools are required to review and update their Emergency Management Plan (EMP). This important process helps us reflect on our current procedures, identify any improvements needed, and make sure that our school community are aware of what to do should an emergency arise. As part of our commitment to safety, schools must also conduct an emergency management drill once every term. These practice drills prepare our school community for a range of possible situations, such as a bushfire response, lockdown, off-site evacuation, or medical emergency (e.g. snake bite). Practising regularly ensures everyone knows their role and can respond calmly and confidently. Our Term 3 drill will be held soon, and we thank students, staff and families for supporting this important aspect of school safety.

These activities encouraged problem solving, communication, and persistence, with the kids needing to collaborate in order to find the best solutions. One of the highlights was making traditional damper from scratch. Students experimented with different flavourings, carefully mixed their dough, and cooked it before enjoying the results of their efforts. Later, by the river, students collected natural materials to design and build small boats.

You have earned this award for showing respect towards others at Athletics. It was amazing to see you encouraging students from other schools and representing our school in a positive way. Keep up the great work!






