

# EGCMA & Blacksnake Productions

Bryce Watts-Parker represented the East Gippsland Catchment Management Authority, providing insights into the nature of the work undertaken by EGCMA. Mike from Black Snake Productions accompanied the presentation, showcasing his wildlife to enhance the overall experience. This inclusion heightened the excitement of the presentation and offered students an interactive learning experience focused on catchment health. Mike visited us earlier in the year and the kids remembered and were super excited to see him again - with many new and exciting local animals!

After the session, students actively engaged by responding to a brief questionnaire and their feedback for the day was overwhelmingly positive. The incorporation of wildlife and interactive elements left a lasting impression on the students.

Additionally, a future agenda was outlined, including plans to implement various activities. Among them are the construction of a frog hotel, the installation of nest boxes and the organisation of a clean-up day. These initiatives aim to further educate and involve students in environmental conservation efforts.


