








ACTING PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

It is with sincere appreciation and gratitude that I thank all of the staff, students, parents and community for being so supportive and encouraging while I fill Sarah's shoes for Terms 1 & 2 as Acting Principal. I wish Sarah all the best for her time at Newmerella Primary School.

I would also like to welcome our new (and returning) staff starting in 2023. Former Buchan Primary School Principal Andrew Kenyon will be working with the senior class for Term 1, while Sarah is away. All of the students are very excited that Peter Robertson (MARC Van) will also be in weekly, as opposed to fortnightly. We also have Tara King working in the junior classroom in an Education Support Staff role. Kaylene, our school chaplain, has doubled her hours - now working two days a week (Mondays and Thursdays). Julie our business manager and Geof our ICT technician will both continue with the same schedules (Tuesday and Thursdays for Julie, every second Thursday for Geof). Heather Nowell will again be working as our tutor in school who provides additional instruction to students who are behind in Literacy and Numeracy.

Over the holidays we have started the process of redeveloping our literacy program and moving to a more evidence-based and scientifically aligned practice. This has included a total overhaul of assessment practices, new instructional and pedagogical models and the purchase of phonetically controlled (decodable) readers. I also felt like our newsletter was starting to become very antiquated, considering it is 2023! Therefore, I have freshened up the template.

As we are a BARR school (Bushfire At Risk Register) the department have put additional measures in place to minimise risks on high fire danger days. Each student is going to be given a take home diary, this is a place for our students to record their nightly reading, 20 minutes a night can make a huge difference. Students will now be following the evidence and students who have not yet cracked the code will be reading phonetically controlled texts, while students who have mastered the code will take home rich authentic texts from the school library.

Healthy Lunchbox Week is an initiative of Nutrition Australia that helps families access credible lunchbox nutrition information and recipes setting them up for the year ahead.


Around one third of children's daily food intake comes from their unchbox so let's make sure it counts. Use this time to build your bank of unchbox inspiration and know-how.

MARC Van


The Mobile Area Resource Centre (MARC Van) is a small mobile library. Children can borrow any of the picture story books, fictional novels or non-fiction books that are in the van. Students can now also request specific books here: http://bookmark.central.sa.edu.au/EASTGIPPSMARC.htm.

For this term, we will be having MARC lessons once per week. These lessons go for between 90 minutes (juniors) and 2 hours (seniors). During MARC lessons students share a book, discuss different aspects, critically engage with the literature and explore issues in great detail through hands-on activities.

AFL Victoria's School Vision is to deliver AFL in every school across Victoria and offered Buchan Primary School two free AFL Primary Play Program sessions. The first one was held on the 6th of February and was an absolute hit. The second session will be held on the 13th of February.



SCIENCE OF READING

The Science of Reading lives here!

One very important skill our children need to learn during their time with us at Buchan Primary School is the ability to read. Our brains don't naturally learn to read in the same way we learn to walk, talk and listen. As babies, our children can hear our voices and begin to interpret what we are saying, regardless of language, and by about the age of 2 years old, begin to converse with us. The brain is not wired to do this with reading. Our teaching practice will now be reflective of the 40 years of scientific research that has gone into studying how the brain learns. We no longer teach a reading and writing block, rather we integrate it all together.

Strong phonological awareness skills are the single biggest predictor of reading success. It includes recognising phonological patterns such as rhyme and alliteration, awareness of syllables and phonemes within words and hearing multiple phonemes within words. At BPS, we have implemented a phonological awareness program called Heggerty. This is a daily routine for our students which takes place at the beginning of our literacy lessons.

SOME CHANGES TO READING

IF YOUR FAMILY HAS BEEN A PART OF BUCHAN PRIMARY SCHOOL FOR SOME TIME, YOU'LL NOTICE SOME CHANGES IN HOW WE TEACH READING; IF YOU'RE NEW TO BPS, JUMP ON BOARD, IT'S GOING TO BE A FANTASTIC JOURNEY! IT'S AN EXCITING TIME TO BE IN EDUCATION AS WE ALIGN OUR INSTRUCTION WITH THE SCIENCE OF READING!

LISTED BELOW ARE SOME POINTS OF RESEARCH THAT WE WILL BE ADDRESSING AS WE EMBARK ON A NEW SCHOOL YEAR AT BUCHAN PRIMARY SCHOOL.

- CODE EMPHASIS IN PRIMARY GRADES. THIS MEANS THAT GRADES F-2 ESPECIALLY WILL FOCUS ON ACQUIRING THE SKILLS
 TO CRACK THE CODE OF OUR ALPHABET TO THE SPEECH SOUNDS IN ENGLISH. (THERE ARE 44 SPEECH SOUNDS IN
 ENGLISH AND 150 WAYS TO READ AND SPELL THEM!) KIDS MUST FIRST LEARN TO DECODE/SOUND-OUT WORDS BEFORE
 THEY CAN UNDERSTAND THEMEANING OF TEXT, THEREFORE, WE WILL EMPHASIZE INSTRUCTION IN 'CRACKING THE CODE'
 IN GRADES F-2.
- EXPLICIT AND SYSTEMATIC PHONICS INSTRUCTION. WE WILL HAVE AN ORDER OR CONTINUUM OF PHONICS SKILLS, PROGRESSING FROM SIMPLE TO COMPLEX, THAT WILL BE FOLLOWED THROUGHOUT THE EARLY GRADES. STUDENTS WILL PROGRESS THROUGH THE CONTINUUM AS THEY MASTER SKILLS. IN THE INTERMEDIATE GRADES (3-5), WORD STUDY WILL CONTINUE WITH MORE GRAMMAR AND MORPHOLOGY (LEARNING ABOUT WORD PARTS SUCH AS GREEK AND LATIN ROOTS).
 - EARLY INTERVENTION. IF WE SEE ANY SIGNS THAT YOUR CHILD MAY BE STRUGGLING WITH THE FOUNDATIONAL SKILLS
 OF READING, WE WILL NOT TAKE A 'WAIT AND SEE' APPROACH; WE WILL IMMEDIATELY IMPLEMENT INTERVENTIONS
 AND MONITOR THEIR PROGRESS. THE BEST SOLUTION TO THE PROBLEM OF READING FAILURE IS EARLY IDENTIFICATION
 AND INTERVENTION.
 - PHONEMIC AWARENESS. THIS IS THE ABILITY TO GET TO THE INDIVIDUAL SOUNDS IN WORDS BY LISTENING AND TO IDENTIFY AND MANIPULATE THOSE SOUNDS ORALLY. WHILE THIS SKILL WILL BE EMPHASIZED IN GRADES K-2, WE WILL MAKE SURE ALL STUDENTS AT BPS HAVE THIS NECESSARY FOUNDATION. STUDENTS IN THE MIDDLE GRADES MAY NEED TO PRACTICE THESE SKILLS UNTIL THEY HAVE FIRMED UP THIS FOUNDATION OF READING. DON'T BE SURPRISED IF YOU HAVE A 3RD - 5TH GRADE STUDENT WORKING ON PHONEMIC AWARENESS! THIS IS AN AREA THAT THE RESEARCH HAS INDICATED IS HUGELY IMPORTANT!
 - DECODABLE READERS. MANY F-3 READERS WILL BE WORKING WITH DECODABLE READERS. THESE ARE BOOKS OR PASSAGES THAT ONLY INCLUDE WORDS THAT THE STUDENTS CAN 'DECODE' (SOUND-OUT) ACCORDING TO THE SKILLS THEY HAVE BEEN TAUGHT THUS FAR. OUR KIDS NEED PRACTICE WITH THE PHONICS SKILLS THEY ARE LEARNING AND THESE BOOKS AND PASSAGES PROVIDE THAT PRACTICE. SO BE AWARE THAT AT TIMES, YOUR PRIMARY STUDENTS MAY BE BRINGING HOME A SHEET OF PAPER WITH A PASSAGE FOR PRACTICE OR A DECODABLE BOOK, WE NO LONER USE LEVELLED READERS.
- COMPREHENSION. THE ULTIMATE GOAL OF ALL READING INSTRUCTION IS FOR STUDENTS TO UNDERSTAND WHAT THEY READ. THE MODEL OF THE SIMPLE VIEW OF READING (PREVIOUS PAGE AND BOTTOM RIGHT ON THIS PAGE)
 DEMONSTRATES THAT READING COMPREHENSION OCCURS ONLY WHEN STUDENTS
 HAVE BOTH DECODING/WORD RECOGNITION SKILLS AND LANGUAGE COMPREHENSION SKILLS. CHILDREN NEED THE ESSENTIAL SKILLS TO GET THE WORDS OFF THE PAGE AS WELL AS KNOWLEDGE, VOCABULARY, AND A GOOD UNDERSTANDING OF HOW OUR LANGUAGE WORKS IN ORDER TO COMPREHEND WHAT THEY READ. WE MUST PROVIDE INSTRUCTION THAT WILL HELP STUDENTS ACHIEVE THESE GOALS.
