



East Gippsland Coffee Roasters is owned and run by Tim and Rach Songalio. Their shop is located in the main street of Orbost, where they produce freshly house-roasted coffee, which they sell wholesale to other businesses.

They also serve brunch which includes toasted





Tim and Rach first got their business idea when they couldn't find a good quality and consistent coffee locally, so they decided to roast at home. After receiving lots of positive feedback from friends and neighbours, they decided to open up their own shop where Tim works full-time keeping up with online orders, and providing quality coffee, food and friendly service to customers on the street. Tim's future vision for the business is to help see the town of Orbost develop and grow, not only for the local economy but to also improve the general well being of the local community. EGCR aspires to be part of the 'reinvention' of Orbost.

EGCR have a wide range of products/coffee blends on offer such as the Skippers Roast featuring beans from Ethiopia, which are ideal for Espresso with notes of 'Apricot, lemongrass, chestnuts and caramel'. Other premium varieties of coffee beans include *Sweet Jeanie* and *Ladies Who Roast*, which both offer different taste notes. Each variety of beans comes in colourful, eye-catching packaging featuring artworks from local artist's.

My work experience placement was at Orbost Auto Electrics.

My highlight of work experience was...

My highlight was when Liam (the apprentice that was there, he's a second year) and I sent sparks everywhere when we were testing a light on the test bench. There was also another time when we were testing a battery with a multimeter and we almost blew it up because we had one of the cords in the wrong hole and the multimeter cords got hot and almost broke it by accident. I also enjoyed going out with Todd on jobs. Another good time was when I almost took a pair of side cutters home with me because I left them in my back pocket after working on a job, I did return them after one of my school friends noticed them in my back pocket. Todd Gilimour offered to be a reference on my resume for job or apprenticeship applications.

Something new that I discovered was...

Something new that I learnt was how to wire driving lights to your headlights and how to solder properly. I learnt the neater way to connect wires. Liam decided to give me the job of wiring up the stereo and fastening the wires together. I then went to wire them so that they ran together, but Liam showed me how to put them tip to tip and twist them together and then solder them. This made the connections a lot easier and neater to work with. After putting the stereo back into the car the wires were all able to neatly be zip tied together.

A challenging moment was when...

Taking a pair of driving lights off an old Toyota. It was difficult to get off because of where the bolts were situated. The pins to the terminals were hard to get off as well because you couldn't get a spanner into where the nuts on the bottom were. Also fixing a heater in a truck this was my first job so most of what I was doing was a little confusing. But we ended up fixing it after about an hour.





The Grange P-12 College

On the 5th-9th of June I undertook work experience placement took place at The Grange P-12 College (Callistemon Campus) in Hoppers Crossing. This school offers many classes that can help provide students with all the education they need from prep to year 6 as the high school is separated. My tasks were to help students in any way possible so that they understood what they were learning..

My highlight of work experience was...

During the week, a significant highlight for me was when all the students I worked with became more comfortable with me. This only took about a day, but it was an amazing feeling when it happened.

My supervisor identified on my evaluation form that my attendance and punctuality, appearance and presentation were great, working with others, communication and interpersonal skills, attitude and motivation, ability to learn and quality of work, as well as my ability to work with others with a positive attitude, were the strengths I displayed throughout the week.

Something new that I discovered was...

During the week, I discovered new skills I never knew I had. One of these skills was being able to notice when I child was heightened and taking them out to calm them down. I let this child play on the playground for around 5 minutes but also spoke to him at the same time so I could understand what was going on and try to help. Sometimes people, especially young children just want to be listened to.

A challenging moment was when...

A challenge I encountered during the week was when my prep class had a CRT. As at most schools, the children behaved differently and it became quite challenging at times. The CRT and I worked together to make the class feel comfortable and by the end of the day all was ok.

On reflection, I would consider a career in a classroom as a backup plan if being an Occupational Therapist didn't work out. I would consider this because working with kids is what I love and being in a classroom is still helping them learn, though, just a little differently than an Occupational Therapist.


