








CANN RIVER BUSH DANCE

We went inside the hall and it was the dance time.

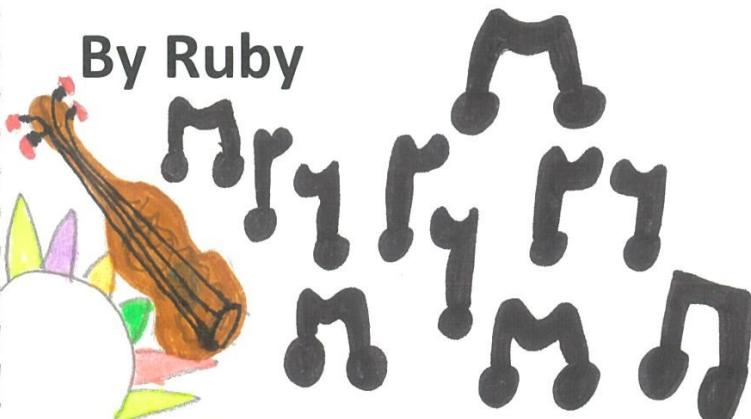

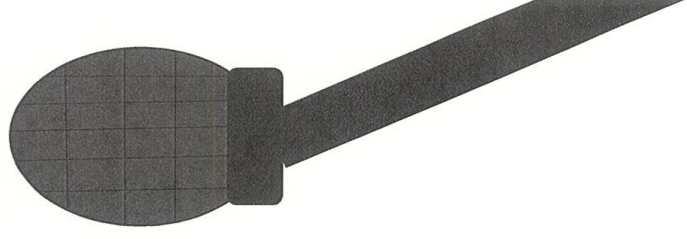
Radio Awareness

We got to make a radio program. We presented the program to the class. The other group had a lot of funny jokes and there were funny laughs at the end of each joke.

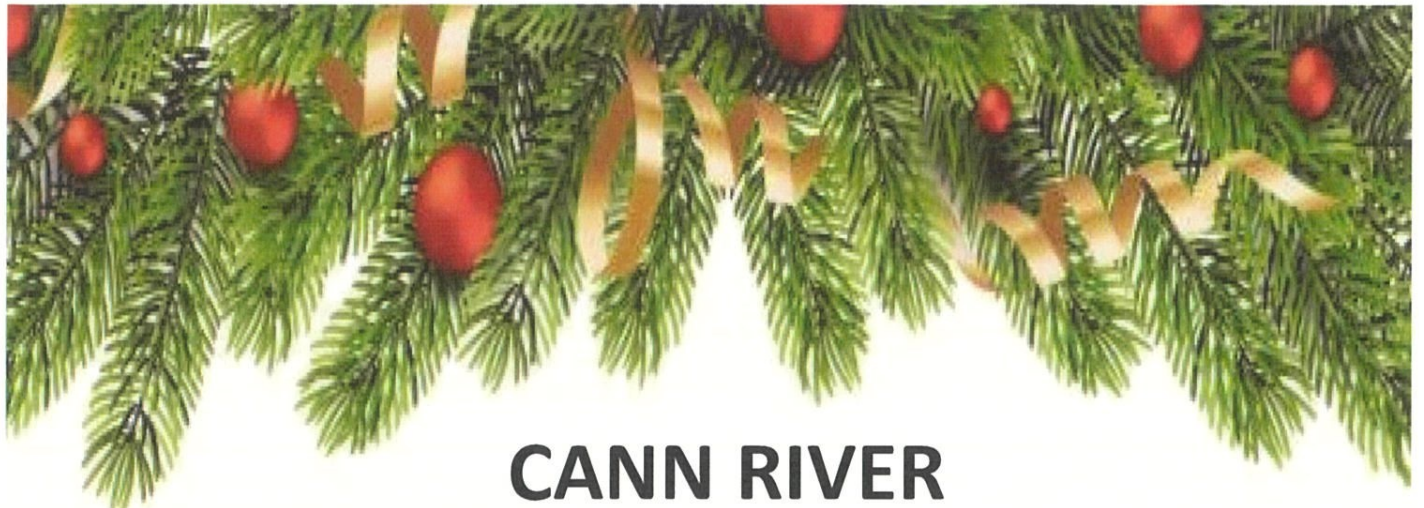
It was fun and we got a disc too. The person's name was John Broughton.



East Gippsland Water activities over the past 12 months

The 2022-23 East Gippsland Water Annual Report is now available highlighting the activities and initiatives undertaken during the past 12 months and close out the 2018-2023 Price Submission investment plan.

Our East Gippsland Water staff have been amazingly resilient, flexible and committed to maintaining essential community water and waste water services during some very challenging years, that included drought, bushfires, a pandemic and floods, said Managing Director Steve McKenzie.

"We continued to address the future needs of our community in 2022/23, through our \$17.58 million capital works program, including \$12.1 million in asset improvements.

"Key projects included a new 430,000L raw water storage tank at Buchan; significant upgrades to the Lakes Entrance Water Recycling Plant to replace ageing infrastructure; Paynesville Water Recycling Plant upgrades to purchase land and install 26 hectares of sprinkler irrigation; commencing a significant program of works at the Bairnsdale Water Recycling Plant and energy efficiency upgrades such as the installation of a 99kW solar array at our Paynesville Water Recycling Plant.

"Community engagement was undertaken to shape customer priorities and preferences for our 2023-2028 investment plan with our Customer Advisory Committee playing an instrumental role relating to service preferences, service levels and financial assistance for customers experiencing genuine financial difficulty.

"It is also great to see our Board providing a clear positive influence on our strategic direction and confirm the need to significantly increase our capital works and operations investment to secure reliable services to cater for climate variability and population growth" concluded Steve.
