## **Activities week**

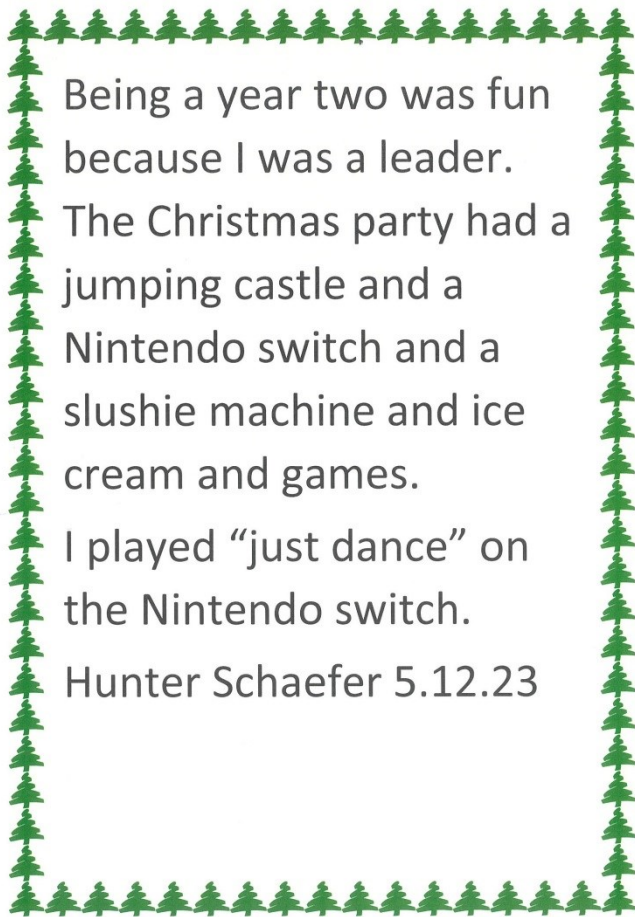

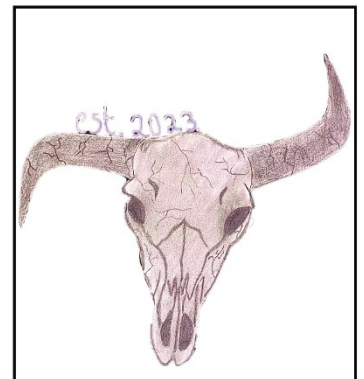






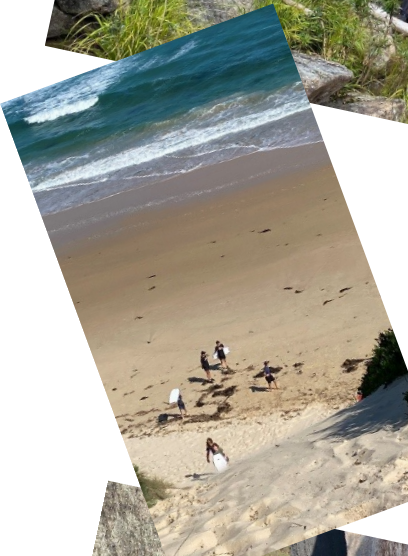
## YEAR 7/8 VCD T-SHIRT DESIGNS

# V.E.T Auto Camp 2023

Every year the Cann River V.E.T Auto kids are lucky enough to be taken to Melbourne to see how automotive businesses and new innovation take shape in the big city.

This year Jack Connley, Hailey Gardner and Nicole Rutjens made the trek to the big smoke along with the Orbost Secondary cohort, led by the excursion founder, David Thexton.

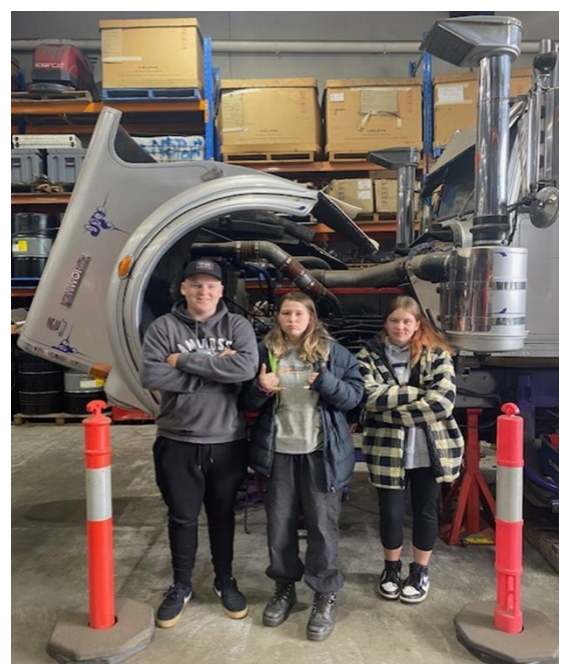
