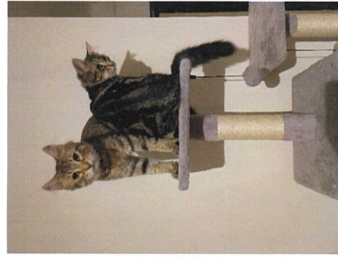
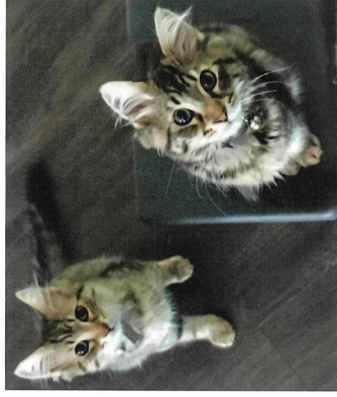
We are so proud of the way our students have supported one another, faced new challenges with courage, and represented our school with kindness and respect.

What a wonderful way to finish Term 3 - full of fun, laughter, and adventure!

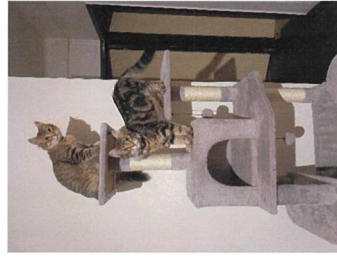


DOOM

When the cats sleep, my dad snores. The cats wake up and stare at Dad because Dad is snoring so loud.



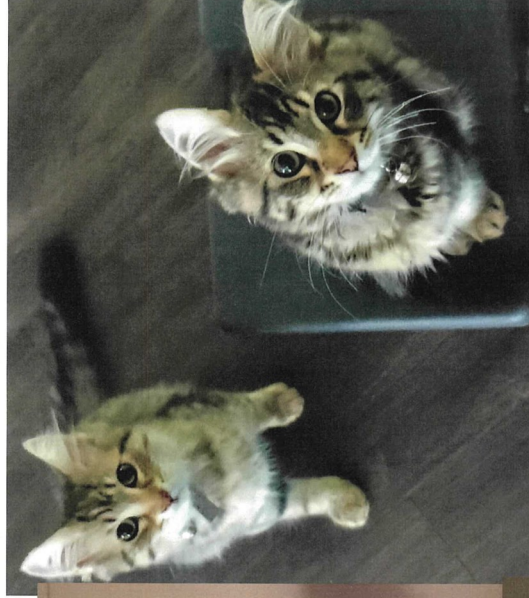
Doom purrs when I stroke him under the chin, he purrs when he is under the blanket and Doom meows when he is looking for Tabby.

“Aww!” I hit the cat toys and face-planted.

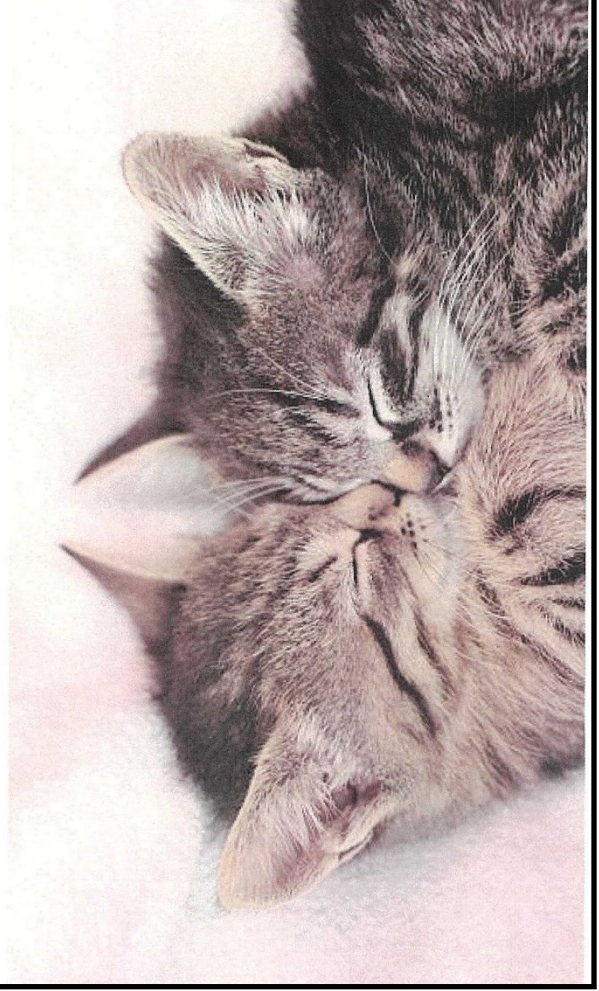
My parents said “Oh no, the power went out.”

Next you fold it like a house with two angles just like this.



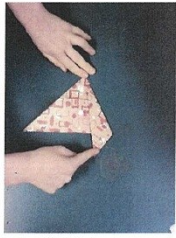
Following that, you fold the bottom of the paper house. It is meant to look like this.

During Term 3, grades 5 and 6 studied Earth Sciences. Students learnt about the earth's structure, the earth's atmosphere and the solar system. These topics were linked to their English studies, where they researched, wrote and published an informative text on 'Why Volcanoes Erupt'.



WHY DO VOLCANOES ERUPT



Have you ever wondered what that large bang came from inside your hometown volcano? Ever started running from high viscosity volcanic gas and then wondered: How did that happen? You might be asking: Why do volcanoes erupt?

Your hometown volcano formed from movement in the earth's plates. Earthquakes, tsunamis, and volcanoes all come from these guys moving. And then, out of nowhere, you see a giant lump of rock and magma. Who would have known it has huge explosions and lava eruptions sometimes! But how?

How do volcanoes erupt

When magma builds up inside a volcano, it finds a way to surface and erupts. It's pushed up from pressure inside the volcano and when it reaches the surface, it's called lava. When lava dries it becomes igneous rock. Here's a diagram of a volcano and how it erupts.

But it's not as simple as that. Different volcanoes have different types of magma.

High viscosity volcanoes

High viscosity volcanoes have very sticky, hot lava with loads of explosions. They also emit gas and sometimes poisonous gas! Magma traps the gas, and over time, the pressure builds up and finally the volcano explodes.

Low viscosity volcanoes

These volcanoes exhibit gentle, easily flowing lava, to put it simply. It doesn't trap gas, (as it is runny) and instead of sticky magma it flows quickly. They tend to produce shield volcanoes.

Shield volcanoes are long, wide volcanoes that produce basaltic lava that flows over its broad, shield-like slope.

Some examples of low viscosity volcanoes are:



Kilauea



Mauna Kea

That's not a tsunami, that's a volcano!

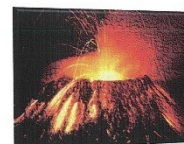
Why Volcanoes Erupt

Why do Volcanoes erupt?

A volcano is a big mountain that has lava in it. Due to magma which is molten rock under the earth's surface.

There can be a buildup of gases that make holes on the side of the volcano, the gases float to the top of the volcano. When there is a lot of magma in the volcano the magma builds up and erupts.

Scientists know when volcanoes are going to erupt by ground deformation. Magma rising to the surface makes the volcano swell or bulge. Scientists must be smart to do this.



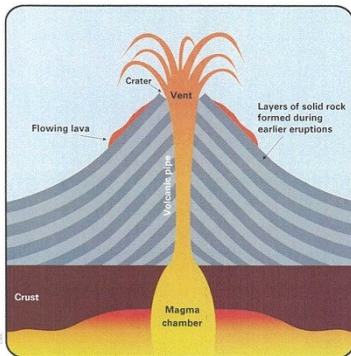
Conclusion

Volcanoes are known for big eruptions and hot lava. They erupt due to a build-up of magma in the earth's crust and pour out molten lava that dries into rock. So next time your escaping death from a high viscosity volcano with immense pressure, remember to stop and admire that poisonous gas.

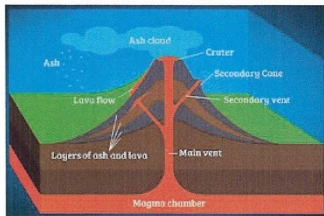
Volcano Eruptions

Today ladies and gentlemen, boys and girls I am going to tell you how and why volcanoes erupt. This happens when the pressure build up is too much to handle and it all comes out with a big boom!!!



Krafft, a volcanologist and a movie cinematographer.

A volcano erupts due to the buildup of rising magma and 44,000 psi of pressure within the earth's crust. We know this because scientists use Ground Deformation, which is a device like a GPS or InSTAR that measures changes in the volcanoes shape, by indicating magma movement. 'A volcanoes pre-eruption state is like having "the shivers" like a sick person, accompanied by ground shaking, swelling, and changes in gas composition and temperature, resembling a fever,' said Maurice



The magma makes its way to the earth's surface by squishing and squeezing through the nooks, crannies and fissures, in between the soil. We know this because scientists use a Tiltmeter to measure subtle changes in the ground's shape, showing us, ground deformation made by

magma propelling upwards. A scientist quoted this, but I do not know the scientists name, but he must be very smart, this is the quote. 'the Flow of magma from the chamber into the crack gradually pressurizes and widens the crack,' said Paul Mcleod is a scientist, and Stephane Tait is a Senior research fellow at the Australian Centre for Water and Environmental Biotechnology.



Magma turns into lava, when the magma a molten rock found beneath the earth's surface, reaches about 700oc to 1,300oc, and for some reason when it comes out of a volcano it is called lava, lava comes from the Italian word likely driven from the latin word labes meaning fall or slide.

So the topic that I explained to you was how and why volcanoes erupt. And now you know that the magma flows to the volcano by squeezing through the nooks and crannies and when it finally reaches the volcano top the pressure build up will finally reach 44,000 psi it will erupt.

Hello and welcome back or to the earth science podcast and today we're going to talk about three facts about volcanoes and how they form.

Fact 1 volcanoes erupt because the magma becomes more pressurized and rises up the volcano due to the high pressure and then BOOM! It erupts.

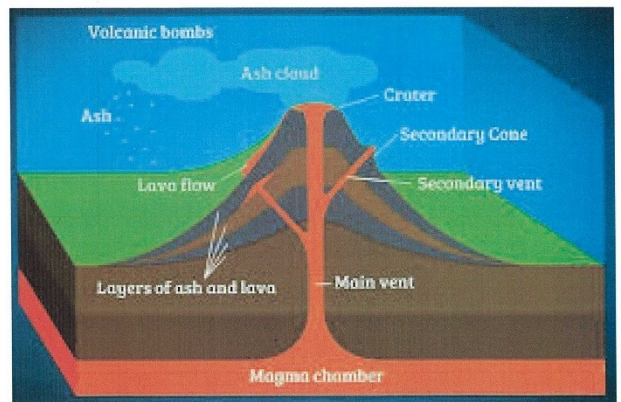
Fact 2 volcano Krakatoa erupted last on the 3 February 2022.



Fact 3 volcanoes have been erupting for 4 billion years.

Explaining Volcanic Eruption

Throughout history, volcanic eruptions have shaped many things, but have you ever wondered how they even erupt in the first place?



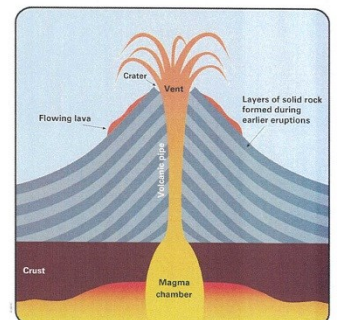
A volcano is an opening in the earth's crust that lets lava, ash and gases to leave a magma chamber underground. One of the common causes of volcanic eruption is the movement of tectonic plates. Tectonic plates are giant rocks that move around and bump into each other and sometimes cause natural disasters (like volcanic eruption).

Another cause for volcanoes eruption is gas build-up. This happens when gases in the magma bubble when the pressure decreases. Magma with high viscosity traps gases and causes pressure build-up and eruptions. Magma with low viscosity lets the gases escape easily which causes less dangerous eruptions.

Sometimes eruptions are caused by magma buoyancy and pressure. Magma is less dense than the rock that surrounds it, and then rises due to buoyancy, therefore causing an eruption.

Those are some common causes for volcanic eruption

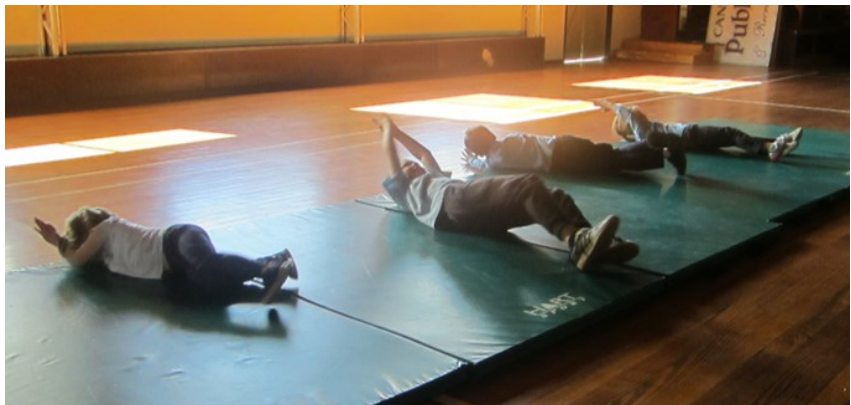

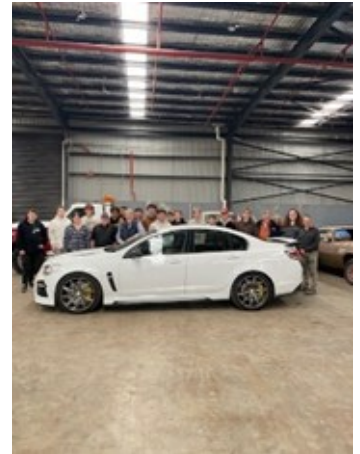
VET Auto Trip to Melbourne with Orbost community college
