Thank you to Kelly for organizing the excursion and to Matt for taking the time to teach the students.

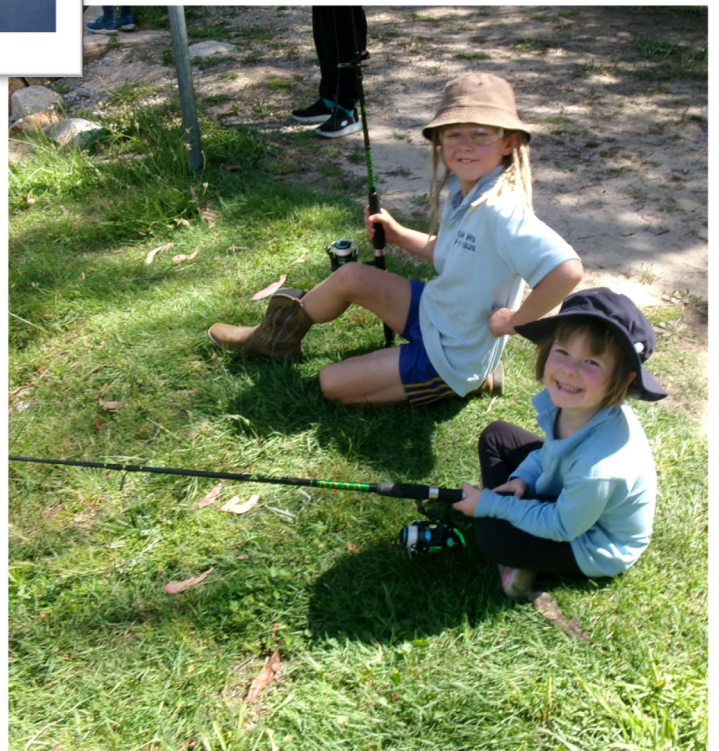

Five Nights at Freddy's – Bella W.

Five Nights at Freddy's is an independent horror game created by Scott Cawthon in 2014.

Originally, Scott Cawthon made Christian games for kids, which often contained small animals, and often didn't have many players. These small animals would be established as some of the most recognizable game-characters in the horror genre, when a critic of his games stated that these animals looked "Almost robotic".

This critic had given Scott Cawthon an idea.

Five Nights at Freddy's:

The first game in the FNaF franchise. This game starred 4 main characters: Chica, a yellow chicken animatronic, Bonnie, a blue bunny (which some people think is purple?) Foxy, a red fox, and of course, Freddy Fazbear, a brown bear with a signature top hat and bowtie.

The game was very simple. You play as a nightguard (Michael Afton) is monitoring these animatronics that "came to life" at night with cameras. You have two doors, both of which have lights that use up your power, to check if an animatronic is at your door.

From here, if you don't close the door when seeing an animatronic, the player is punished with a jumpscare.

When your power went out, you would be unable to close the doors or check the lights, making jumpscare inevitable.

The goal was to make it out alive by the end of your 5 shifts at 6 AM.

This first game became incredibly popular in 2014 through lets-plays. Famous youtubers such as Markiplier, Pewdiepie, and Jacksepticeye, led this game to become as big as it is.

FNaF 1 Lore:

The beginning of what would become an insanely convoluted storyline began here, the first Five Nights at Freddy's.

There are many theories that sparked in 2014. People wanted answers—why are these colourful animatronics trying to kill a nightguard?

What has been widely accepted by the FNaF community is this;

You play as Michael Afton in the first game, son of William Afton. William Afton is the Co-owner of the Freddy Fazbear Pizzeria restaurant, next to Henry Emily—the man who created these animatronics.

Now, William Afton is kind of a psycho, he's suggested to have murdered children (Gabriel; Freddy, Susie; Chica, Fritz; Foxy, Jeremy; Bonnie) by luring them in wearing a yellow bunny suit. He would then stuff their corpses into these animatronic suits.

This wouldn't go unnoticed, though. People had heard about the missing children, and demanded that there be security put in place to prevent whoever was kidnapping these kids. William Afton was given a new name: The man behind the slaughter.

MattPatt's theories suggest that these animatronic suits contained a special kind of metal that would allow these children's spirits to control these suits.

While there have been theories of the nightguard actually being William Afton in the first game, the animatronics seek revenge—this has been disproved. What's actually happening is that these animatronics' assume you to be an endoskeleton (the metal skeleton of an animatronic), and so they must put you inside of an animatronic suit.

Here's where the theories really popped off though—Golden Freddy.

In the first game there was something like a 1 out of 300,000 percent chance that a Golden Freddy would appear to jumpscare you. On top of that, there was another chance of Golden Freddy appearing on a poster.

People wanted to find out who Golden Freddy was. In the beginning, it was believed that Golden Freddy was the soul of Cassidy.

You know those kids I was talking about? Some people thought that not only did William Afton kill children, but that he killed Henry's child, too, whose spirit would possess Golden Freddy. This wouldn't align with future games, though. So this question remained unanswered until...

FNaf 2:

The second game in the franchise. This game introduces more animatronics, like the withered, but these guys aren't too important right now. The main animatronics have had a glow up and are now called Toy Chica, Toy Bonnie, Mangled (who has replaced Foxy), and Toy Freddy. Another important animatronic was The Puppet, and one called Mangled.

The game essentially functions like the first game, again you are a nightguard (Michael Afton), there are two doors (now replaced with vents) that you can shine a light on. However, this time there is no door to shut on. Instead you are given a fake Freddy mask to put on. This Freddy mask would trick Toy Bonnie and Chica, though to get rid of Mangled you'd have to shine your torch in his face.

The new animatronic, The Puppet, has a music-box that must be rewinded. Rewinding this too late, or not at all, will result in a jumpscare.

The second FNaf game also introduced a new animatronic called Balloon Boy, who resembled a little boy. He would steal the batteries in your torch because he's a hater.

The Lore:

The animatronics from the old establishment are no longer used, aside from being scraps for the newer animatronics. Now they're even MORE scary and evil. These are the unimportant "withered" animatronics.

Again, the animatronics think you're an endoskeleton and are trying to stuff you into an animatronic suit.

Now Henry has implemented security features. The Puppet was created to keep children safe and away from the man behind the slaughter, this unfortunately wasn't able to keep William Afton away from Henry's daughter, Cassidy.

FNaf 2 introduced minigames. By pressing certain buttons or going to certain points, you could unlock an easter egg in the game. In one of these minigames, a purple man is seen chasing kids and putting them into suits. Sounds familiar?

William Afton is also now referred to as "Purple Guy". But this also sparked a new question for the FNaf fans, why is he purple?

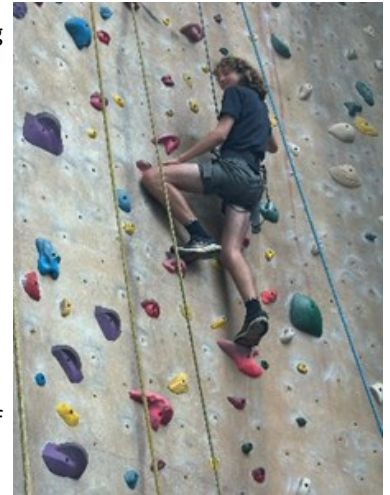

Jacque's Urban Camp

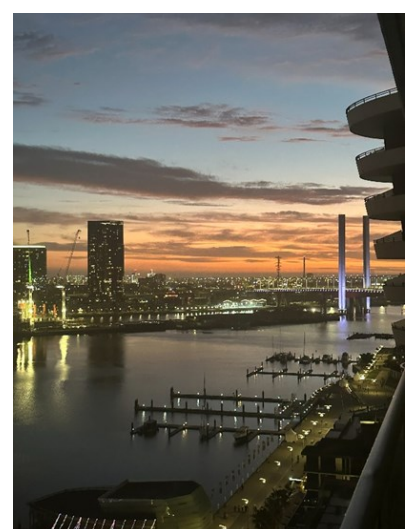
On the 19th of October the Year 9-10's travelled by bus and train to the City of Melbourne. We had a 2-hour bus ride to Bairnsdale station; from there we caught a train to Pakenham east and then caught another Bus from Pakenham to Southern Cross station in Melbourne.

When we got to the hotel, the view was so amazing. We had a view overlooking the harbor, if you walked out onto the balcony and looked to the right you would see The Bolte Bridge lit up in all different colors. From our bedroom windows you could see the tall buildings across from our building. You could see everyone walking beside the water, Jesse and I loved looking at the cars passing by on the road. We saw a yellow Nissan Skyline and a few Gr86's. The view was so nice up on the 17th level, I wish we hadn't left.

On the first day, we went rock climbing. We got a lesson from one of the workers on how to clip onto the ropes and how to belay. A belayer is the person at the bottom of the wall, the belayer makes sure that the climber's rope is always tight, so if the climber loses their grip, they won't tumble down the wall. We all started off with the smaller walls and once we were confident, we moved to the taller walls. All the lines up the walls had different ratings, some were a 9 which is super easy, some were as high as 23 which is super hard. Some of the climbing holds were really hard to grip onto since they were basically flat on top, the ones that curved into themselves I liked because it gave me an easy grip, but some grips were definitely harder than others. The furthest I made it up the wall was about 3 quarters up; I always set a marker for how the up the wall I wanted to get then I would work from there. I think setting a marker was helpful as it gave me something to aim for when climbing. Rock Climbing was really fun, I wish I got to do it more often.

On Tuesday Night, we all went out to the Urban Alley Brewery in District Docklands and had some lovely Parmas. The chips were cooked just right, they were crunchy but not too crunchy, the chicken was cooked to perfection, the ham, cheese and tomato on top added the right flavors to what is one of Australia's classic meals. Dining out in the city at night is something special all the lights and all the buildings make it seem really special, and it's even better when the food is super good. 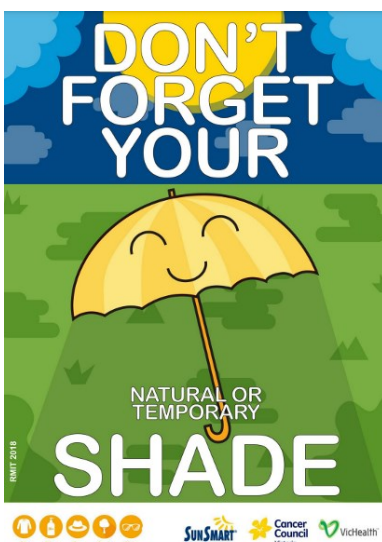
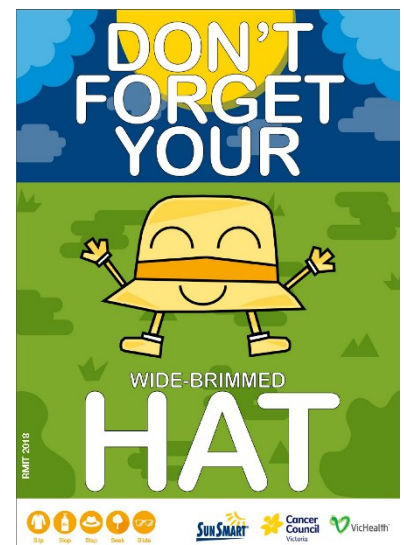
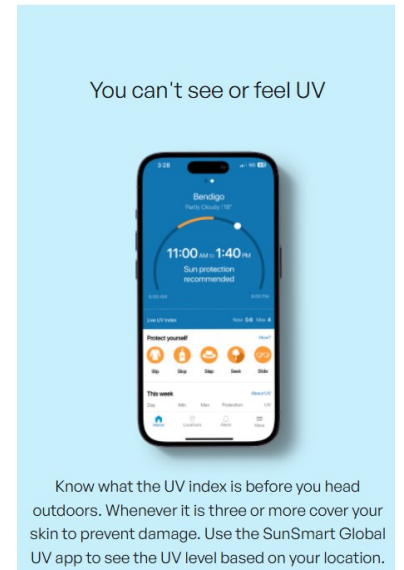
