SPANAKOPITA (Greek Spinach Pie)



In the garden

We picked two bags of fresh garden greens for the pie and washed the leaves.

Cooking together

We cut the greens into small pieces, add sea salt and soaked in cold water for 10 –15 minutes.

Then we drained to dry the greens and pre-heated the ovens.

On the baking trays, we layer eight sheets of pastry and lightly coated each sheet with butter.

Now the pastry

We added the fresh greens mixture on the pastry and then placed the rest of the pastry sheet on top of the pie (5 sheets).

Students' coated each sheet again with butter and sprinkled with cheese. Ready to bake.

Cook well on 2:40 degrees

Celsius for one hour.

Smelt delicious!!

Ingredients

Black pepper & salt, butter, feta cheese (crumbled), half a cup of Greek yogurt, eggs, parsley, dill, spring onions and finely chopped mint.

Mixed well.

This term in Health, our Year 4, 5 and 6 students have embarked on an exciting hands-on project as they work together to recreate the human body! So far, students have carefully constructed the skeleton of their substitute teacher with plaster sheets, empty paper rolls and light wood. Once finished the skeleton will be placed inside a life-sized body mold of their classroom teacher. Next week, students will begin exploring and creating the brain and nervous system, learning how messages travel throughout the body and control our movements and reactions. Each week, students investigate a different body system, creating detailed models and labels to deepen their understanding of how the human body works. It has been wonderful to see students collaborating, problem-solving and enthusiastically engaging in their learning.

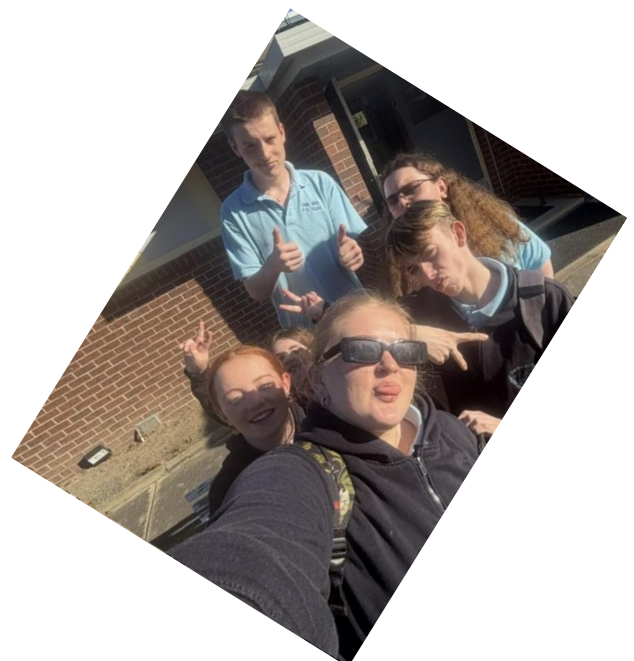

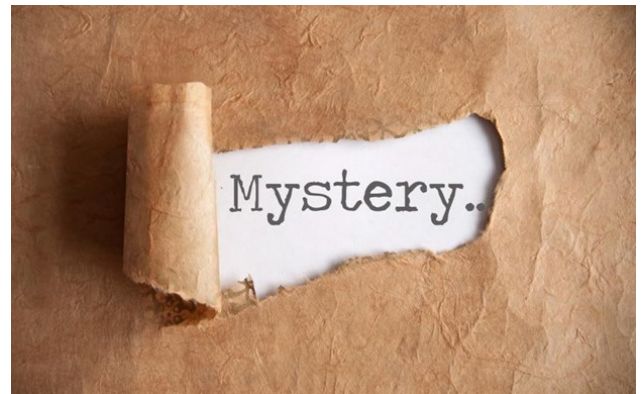

VCE English

In VCE English with Mrs Hodges, students have been developing their creative writing skills by exploring tone and authorial voice, using *Harrison Bergeron* as a mentor text.

Students analysed how Vonnegut constructs a calm, matter-of-fact tone to present an unsettling society, before shifting into a more dramatic tone during moments of rebellion. They then applied this understanding by writing a short creative piece that established a clear societal rule, explored its impact, and introduced a "rebel" character to create a deliberate tone shift.

The task supported students to understand how tone can position readers and deepen ideas about control, individuality, and protest. Below are a selection of samples that showcase students' creativity and developing control of tone in their writing.

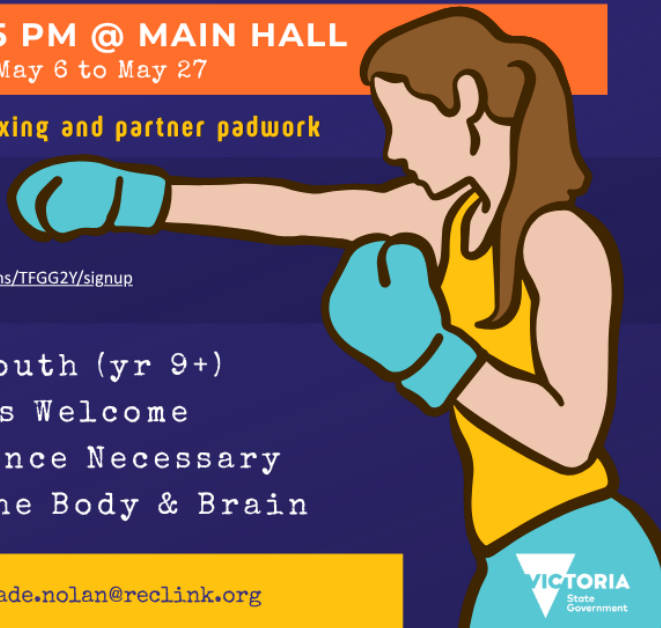
