

What a fabulous Term we are having in the Prep classroom! Sarah and I are so very proud of how the Preps have settled into school. We have been encouraging the children to be independent with their belongings and look after all of their and the school's property. For Reading groups, we read 'My Car' and 'The Smeds and the Smoos'. The Preps completed activities that reinforced their understanding of the stories. Thank you to parents for continuously reading at home; if we could please have readers returned every day, that would be great.

Within our writing block, we have been completing sentence starters such as 'On the weekend I...' and 'My friends at school are...'. For handwriting, this term we are concentrating on correct pencil grip, formation, starting points, size, and posture while writing. This term we introduced the following high-frequency golden words: a, and, b, I, in, is, it, of, that, the, to, and was. We will be using the high-frequency words in both our reading and writing.

In Soundwaves, we focused on the letters 'a', 'l', and 'h', and last week made tasty Ham and Cheese toasties!

For Maths, our focus is on building a solid understanding of numbers 1-20 through visualising numbers, finding patterns, counting, comparing, sequencing, and linking objects to the number names and symbols that represent them.

For Handwriting, we have been continuing practising writing our alphabet letters and names.

We are all looking forward to our excursion next Tuesday to the Forge Theatre to see 'The Smeds and the Smoos'. This is a reminder for parents and guardians to complete forms on uEducateUs.

I also will be reaching out to organise Parent-teacher meetings in the next week and look forward to meeting our Prep families.
