Here we are almost at the end of Term 1 and Easter is just around the corner. Tiredness is creeping in, and feet are beginning to drag, but despite this our students continue to amaze us with great work and progress. Prep Class

Wow the weeks have just flown by! We are already in week 8! We are beyond thrilled with how the Prep's have settled in and how hard they have worked this term. It is so great seeing them become more confident with letter and number recognition and writing.

For Reading groups, we read 'Where is Pat?', 'We're Going on a Bear Hunt' and 'Into Space'. The Preps completed activities that reinforced their understanding of the stories. Thank you to parents for continuously reading at home; if we could please have readers returned every day, that would be great.

For Soundwaves and Handwriting, we focused on the letter's 'L' and 'M'. Each week the Preps need to collect 20 stars in order to do a cooking activity on Wednesday. For the past 2 weeks we made Lemonade and Milo Milkshakes!

For Maths, we are continuing our learning and exploration of numbers from 1 to 20. We have been completing our Maths Trek work and playing maths games. We have also begun looking at patterns and using concrete materials such as beads and Unifix.

Within our writing block, we are regularly completing sentence starters such as 'On the weekend I...' and reading stories and writing about what happened in the story.

For handwriting, this term we are still concentrating on correct pencil grip, formation, starting points, size, and posture while writing. We have also been playing memory games that involve the golden words.

In Soundwaves, we focused on the letter's 'l', 'm', and 'b', and lemonade and milo milkshakes! The Preps loved making both and especially drinking them!

We had a wonderful time on our excursion to the 'The Smeds and the Smoos'. It was great seeing the children joining in with the singing and dancing parts

of the show.

It has been wonderful having the Parent Teacher Interviews with Prep parents. I really appreciate hearing about how your child is travelling. Please do not hesitate to reach out if we can support your child in any way at school.

Senior Class

As we come to the end of Term 1 it has been great to see our students have worked hard on all their learning.

This fortnight in Soundwaves, students learned about the sounds 'i' for igloo and 'f' for fish. Students also learned about compound words, more suffixes and prefixes, as well as continuing learning more about Greek and Latin roots.

In reading students finished their unit on fact and opinion and have moved onto finding the main idea. They are learning that they can often find the main idea in the first sentence or the last, and what is supporting detail.

In our handwriting sessions, students have been working on a variety of formations, such as: downward strokes, closed anti-clockwise letters, parts of letters, touch joins, horizontal joins, diagonal joins and speed loops.

In writing students selected the historical voyage to research and began writing dot points for each section of the text. Next week we will finish writing.

In maths groups students completed learning tasks about collecting and organising data, predicting outcomes, modelling to help solve questions, calculating money, budgets, line graphs, categorical and numerical data, using the area model to help with multiplication, properties of angles, renaming fractions and solving multi-step problems.

<u>Japanese</u>

We have only had one Japanese lesson this fortnight because of the public holiday. The senior class worked on asking someone's name and answering, as well as consolidating number knowledge to 100. The junior class also worked on introductions and numbers to 20. All students have been working well in class and Sensei Mai is amazed at how well they are progressing.

History

Gold is our topic during our history lessons this fortnight. We have learned about its value and how rare it is. We have also learned about how currency has moved from local trading of goods to the Australian dollars we use today.
