#### **Junior Room**

It's been another great few weeks in the Junior Room! The students have been working so hard and showing fantastic focus!

In Literacy, we've been learning about digraphs — th, ph, ng, ch, and sh — and exploring how these sounds help us in both reading and spelling. We've also been looking at punctuation, particularly exclamation marks and question marks, which ties perfectly into our persuasive writing unit. Students have been learning about statement and question sentences and using conjunctions like 'and', 'but' and 'so' to make their sentences more detailed and interesting.

In Maths, we've continued learning about measurement and have now moved on to 3D shapes! We've been exploring vertices, edges, surfaces, and faces, as well as continuing to practise number bonds, addition and subtraction, and friends of ten. The improvement in students' fluency each session has been amazing to see, and I'm really looking forward to their results in the upcoming assessment for this unit.

In SOSE, we've moved on from learning about Australia and are now exploring the continent of Asia and its geography. The students have enjoyed discovering new countries, cultures, and landmarks as we continue our world exploration.

We also held our first Prep Transition session last Friday, and it went incredibly well. We spent the morning getting to know everyone, playing games, reading The Gruffalo, and creating our very own monsters inspired by the story. We're really excited about the rest of the transition journey.

We are now at the point in the Semester where we're completing a range of assessments for both Literacy and Maths, and I'm so proud of effort everyone is putting in.

#### Middle Room

Here we are in Week Four already, time is certainly flying by! In class, we are almost at the end of our current novel *Off We Go Around Australia* by Roland Harvey. This wonderful book follows a family on holiday from the tip of the Top End all the way out west, exploring the many magical things to see and do across Australia. Sailing and surfing, caving and kayaking, camping under big skies, and exploring there's never a dull moment! The students have loved following the adventure and trying to find Uncle Kev, who has gone missing while searching for the elusive Night Parrot.




We have had a very busy 2 weeks in the Senior Room.
