Principal's Report

Transition:

This week marks the beginning of our transition program for our 2026 Prep students. We are excited to welcome our new Preps, who will join us each Friday for the next eight weeks as they begin their journey from kindergarten to school life.

If you are yet to complete your enrolment forms, please contact the school as soon as possible. Planning is well underway for our 2026 classes, and it's important that we have accurate enrolment numbers to support this process.

As part of our whole-school approach to transition, our current Prep students will spend each Friday working in the Year 1/2 learning area to help them adjust to next year's routines and expectations. Likewise, our Grade 2 students will spend Fridays in the Year 3/4 area as they prepare for the next stage of their learning.

Students in all other year levels will also take part in a range of transition activities throughout the term. These experiences give teachers valuable insight into how students learn and work together, supporting thoughtful class placements for 2026. Towards the end of the term, all students will participate in their final transition sessions with their 2026 classmates and teachers.

Special Requests for placement of students in 2026:

Each year parents are able to put in writing, an individual request for their child's class placement in 2026. Parents have until Friday 7th November to complete their request and hand it into the office. We will not be able to accommodate late requests as the process takes us quite some time. Please do not make verbal requests, as it is too easy for them to be forgotten or overlooked. All requests should be sealed in an envelope, addressed to Mr Prior and handed into the office. He will contact any parents directly, if he need's to clarify any issues that arise from student placements. Parents should only consider making a written request if they have serious educational, social and emotional concerns, over the placement of their child in a particular grade. As the process takes over a month to finalise, once a student is placed in a particular grade, and it is announced to the community towards the end of Term 4, they cannot be moved to a different class. Parents who have made requests in the past should consider making another request if it is still relevant, as requests from previous years are not carried forward. Whilst we will make every effort to take into consideration any written requests, due to the complexity of the process not all requests will be possible to achieve. If you have any further questions regarding this process, please don't hesitate to speak with Mr Prior.

Children's Week:

Children's Week is a national celebration. It recognises the talents, skills, achievements and rights of children. The event takes place in October every year, Children's Week 2025 will be held between 18 October – 26 October 2025.

The Children's Week theme for 2025 is: "Everyone should know about Children's Rights".

Over the next few weeks, we will be running several fun activities at school for our students to celebrate their achievements.

The students have been practicing weekly and all have shown big improvements in their skill sets and understanding of their respective sports.


Big congratulations to both girls and mixed volleyball teams, who won overall and will compete at Division Volleyball next Monday 20th October!
