Principal's Report

Throughout the week, our school will be engaging in a range of exciting activities to promote reading and creativity, as part of our ongoing focus on literacy and the importance of reading. **Our big dress up day will be this Friday 22**nd!! Once again this year, we will be parading around town looking for story tellers to share some of their favourite books. We will be departing school shortly after 9am and parents are welcome to join the parade.

Curriculum Day - Berry Street Training – Day 4.... Yesterday the staff spent the day completing the Berry Street Training. For the last 2 years, all staff have completed the full 4 day training to continue to build of our ability to cater for the individual needs of our students. Each day represented a different aspect of student learning and by focusing on character strengths and core values, the Berry Street Education Model (BSEM) empowers students to become more self-aware, resilient, and positively engaged in both their learning journey and future aspirations.

Yesterday identified a number of strategies including:

Character Strengths

Discussing a framework, which outlines 24 character strengths, the focus is on recognizing and fostering what is *right* within students, highlighting their positive attributes.

Values Exploration

Students are guided to identify, express, and reflect on their own values. This process helps them find personal meaning and extend their understanding to appreciate the values of others.

Understanding Self and Others

The training promotes deeper self-awareness and empathy by encouraging students to explore their identities within the context of their culture and community. This fosters respect and appreciation for diverse character strengths.

Future Pathways

Emphasis is placed on helping students apply their strengths and values to make informed decisions about their education, career, and life goals.

Practical Activities

Engaging exercises include identifying strengths through storytelling, using metaphors and heroic figures to explore character traits, by recognizing and respecting others' strengths.

Positive Hooks and Fun Breaks

To maintain engagement and energy, the training integrates uplifting activities and playful breaks into the learning process.




Art


