


Principal's Report

Celebrating Naplan Success.... Today we received further NAPLAN results, providing a comparison between our school data and State averages. Once again, LEPS students have demonstrated outstanding achievement. As illustrated in the sample below (Grade 3 Numeracy), our students significantly outperformed not only the State average but also other schools in 2025. This is just one example of the many areas in which our students continue to excel.

Notably, the graph below, highlights the three-year average, showing that various groups of students have consistently achieved results well above the State, similar and network schools average over time. Similar patterns of excellence are evident in Reading and Writing.

Our strong Literacy and Numeracy outcomes, combined with a rich and varied extracurricular program, ensure that LEPS students are well-prepared for continued success as they transition from Grade 6.



School Transition.... As we prepare to welcome our 2026 Prep students, we also begin the task of farewelling our Grade 6 cohort as they transition to secondary school.

This year, our students will be moving on to a variety of schools including Nagle, Bairnsdale, Orbost, and LESC. We are also proud to share that two students have received scholarships to attend Gippsland Grammar. Each student will participate in individualised transition sessions tailored to the requirements of their chosen secondary school. These sessions provide valuable opportunities to share academic data and discuss class placements, helping to ensure a smooth and supportive transition. Looking ahead, our 2026 Prep students will begin their transition sessions next term. Running throughout the term, these sessions are designed to help children become familiar with their new environment in a calm and gradual way—removing pressure and setting them up for a confident start on Day One.


