Principal's Report

Transport to school....

As we continue to move through the cold and flu season, we are still seeing the effects of staff and student absences. Whilst we have been relatively lucky, not having too many staff away, parents will continue to see this impact at various stages. Given the shortage of staff across the system and through most industries, we are doing our best to limit the impact on our students. The structures that we have set up should enable any staff member to teach at any level. Some classes have been merged, however this is only occurring when there are a large amount of students away and the remaining students in the class are able to work at the same level. With changes happening just before school starts (or once school has started), the privacy policies we must follow, make it difficult to communicate this at times with families. We will do our best to keep you informed where we can. Thank you for your understanding and support.

School Transition....

As we prepare to welcome our 2026 Prep students, we also begin the task of farewelling our Grade 6 cohort as they transition to secondary school.

This year, our students will be moving on to a variety of schools including Nagle, Bairnsdale, Orbost, and LESC. We are also proud to share that two students have received scholarships to attend Gippsland Grammar. Each student will participate in individualised transition sessions tailored to the requirements of their chosen secondary school. These sessions provide valuable opportunities to share academic data and discuss

class placements, helping to ensure a smooth and supportive

transition.

Looking ahead, our 2026 Prep students will begin their transition sessions next term. Running throughout the term, these sessions are designed to help children become familiar with their new environment in a calm and gradual way—removing pressure and setting them up for a confident start on Day One.

Celebrating Small Wins in Grades 1 & 2B


This term, our focus has been on expanding our understanding of what success truly means. Through rich discussions and thoughtful reflections, students have

"Put it back in the group and keep growing it," Alena suggested but Grace had said it grew on a vine and wouldn't grow anymore.








The Bigger Picture


The students were asked what success they have recently experienced. They drew their response..



Well done to all our *G* rade 1 and 2 students for recognising the value in persistence, effort, and those small-but-mighty successes that lead to greater things!


And to all of our students across the school — keep going, keep trying, and remember that every effort you make matters. Whether it's





The students who attend cannot wait to go each week, learning many valuable skills.












