# Principal's Report

Special Requests for placement of students in 2026.... Each year parents are able to put in writing, an individual request for their child's class placement in 2026. Parents have until Friday 7<sup>th</sup> November to complete their request and hand it into the office. We will not be able to accommodate late requests as the process takes us quite some time. Please do not make verbal requests, as it is too easy for them to be forgotten or overlooked. All requests should be sealed in an envelope, addressed to me and handed into the office directly. I will contact any parents directly, if I need to clarify any issues that arise from student placements. Parents should only consider making a written request if they have serious educational, social and emotional concerns, over the placement of their child in a particular grade. As the process takes over a month to finalise, once a student is placed in a particular grade, and it is announced to the community towards the end of Term 4, they cannot be moved to a different class. Parents who have made requests in the past should consider making another request if it is still relevant, as requests from previous years are not carried forward. Whilst we will make every effort to take into consideration any written requests, due to the complexity of the process not all requests will be possible to achieve. If you have any further questions regarding this process, please don't hesitate to speak with me.

**Prep Transition....** Next week we will hold our first Prep transition for 2026 Preps. Our new students will come every Friday for the remainder of the term to continue to support their learning as they transition from kindergarten to school. Please contact us immediately if you are yet to complete your enrolment forms, as planning is well underway to cater for our new enrolments and our 2026 classroom structure. As part of our whole school approach to transition, our current Prep students will spend each Friday working in a 1/2 class to help them adjust to expectations next year. Students in other grades will also participate in various transition activities throughout the term. This allows us the opportunity to see students work together before determining their final 2026 grades and teachers. All students will participate in their final transition activities with their 2026 grade, in the final weeks of school.

**Children's Week....** Children's Week is a national celebration. It recognises the talents, skills, achievements and rights of children. The event takes place in October every year, Children's Week 2025 will be held between 18 October – 26 October 2025.

The Children's Week theme for 2025 is: "Everyone should know about Children's Rights". Over the next few weeks, we will be running several fun activities at school for our students to celebrate their achievements.

Term 4 ....HATS.... Term 4 is the time when all students (and staff) must wear hats at recess and lunchtime to protect themselves. Please start looking in the bottom of the drawer, or under the bed, for that crumpled hat that hasn't been used for 6 months. We have a policy of 'No hat, No play'. Students who don't have a school Sunsmart hat must go to a shaded area for the duration of the break. Over the next week we will be discussing this with students and monitoring the daily weather report as we move into summer. Please remember school uniform is currently free and we have a limited number of hats for those students who require a new one for the summer.

Where: Lakes Entrance Recreation Reserve (Football & Cricket oval)





Grade 3 – 6 students have been exploring soft oil pastels to create animal characters.




