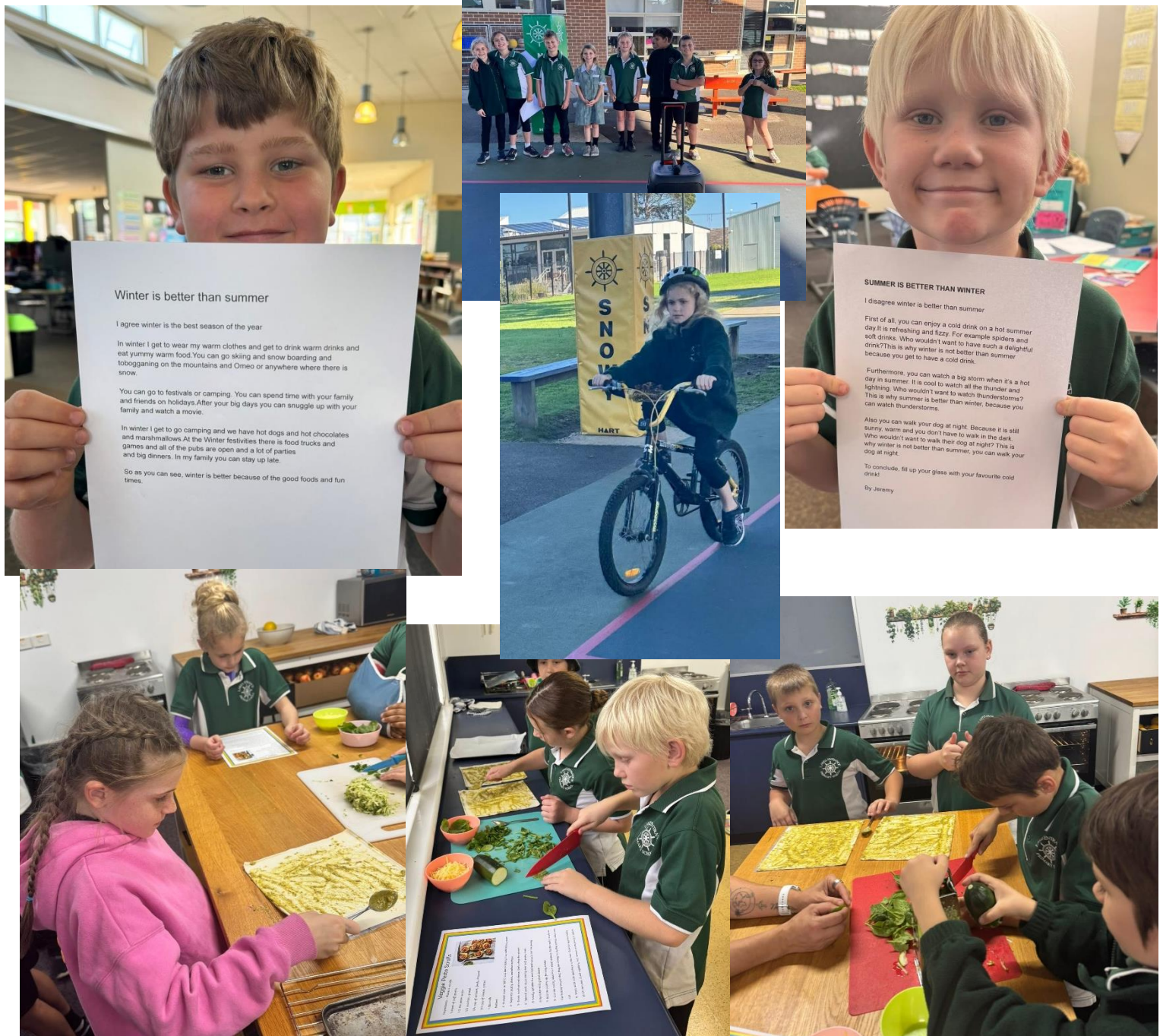


What's been happening in Grades 3/4?
