Principal's Report

School Council: Last year saw many of our long-standing School Council members finish their time with our school and subsequently finish their role with School Council. As a result, we are looking for new members to join. School Council plays a vital role in the overall governance of the school with many different aspects of school operations requiring discussion and approval. It is a relatively easy process, with meetings held roughly twice a term for approximately 1hr in the evening, which can benefit those working during the day with a combination of online and in person meetings. If you are interested in being part of this process, please come past the office to speak to Steph or myself.

The Water Park!!!: Next Friday 20th February we will be holding our annual LEPS Family BBQ on the foreshore. Students will walk across the footbridge around 12:30pm with parent's welcome. A free BBQ will be provided with exclusive access to the Aqua Park for our students. All parents should have received, and returned, a form for students to access the Aqua Park giving their requirements with age limits, along with giving consent via the Compass App. We would love all families to attend.

All students will be dismissed from the foreshore at 3:15pm and will need to be signed out by a parent or guardian.

Students NOT currently enrolled at LEPS will not be able to access the Water Park during this time.

Due to the large number of students, we have again decided to split the water park into 2 groups. This will allow our younger students to access the Water Park first, separate to our older students.

- Students 9yrs and under, require parent supervision on the Water Park, 3:15pm – 4:15pm
- Students older than 9yrs - **4:15pm – 5:15pm**

Please be Careful: This week we have been reminding our students to be extra careful at drop off and pick up times. Afternoons are very busy and with the increased traffic all students need to ensure they are particularly careful and use the appropriate crossings. Police often have a presence around the school targeting speeding motorists through our school zone when the speed limit changes to 40kmh. Local council officers also monitoring parking restrictions and will hand out fines to anyone parked illegally. We actively encourage the support of the local law enforcement officers, to ensure a safe environment for our students coming to and from school, but as a school, we try and advise as many parents as possible to avoid receiving a fine.

Please be well aware of the changes in speed limits and appropriate places to park and cross the road to avoid any fines. Staff will be focussing on the 'Kiss and Drop' parking along Myer Street, where parents must remain in their car during pick up or drop off. Parking will become increasingly difficult once our building work commences, so it would be best to set up a routine early on for pick up and drop off before it gets harder.



Information for Parents

School Council Elections

Calling all parents and carers – We need your help!

In the coming weeks we will send out documents for School Council elections.

We have many positions available and up for re-election.

We are looking for someone to be

- **President of School Council – don't be shy**
- **Fundraising help – Mother's Day/Father's Day Stalls, one of our students favourite fundraisers**
- **Book Club co-ordinator – enter students Book Club orders once a month**
- **And many more roles**

If you are interested in the running of the school and would like to have your say, this might be something for you.

Call the school on 5155 1812 and ask to speak to Simon Prior the Principal or Stephanie Fry the Business Manager. We are happy to answer any questions you may have.

We need a School Council that consists of school staff and parents/carers like you.

There are only 8 meeting for the entire year.

What is a school council and what does it do?

All government schools in Victoria have a school council. They are legally constituted bodies that are given powers to set the broad direction of a school, in accordance with Ministerial Order 1280 *Constitution of Government School Councils, and the Education and Training Reform Act 2006*. In doing this, a school council may directly influence the quality of education for students.

Who is on the school council?

For most primary school councils, there are several possible categories of membership:

A mandated elected parent member category – more than one-third of the total members must be from this category.

Department employees can be parent members at their child's school providing that they are not engaged in work at the school.

A mandated elected school employee member category – members of this category make up no more than one-third of membership. The principal of the school is automatically one of these members.

An optional community member category – members are co-opted by a decision of the council because of their special skills, interests or experience. Department employees are not eligible to be community members.

A small number of school councils have **nominee members**.

For all schools with a Year 7 and above cohort, there is an additional category of membership:

A mandated elected student member category, two positions.

Generally, the term of office for all members is two years. The term of office of half the members expires each year, creating vacancies for the annual school council elections.

Why is parent membership so important?

Parents on school councils provide important viewpoints and have valuable skills and a range of experiences and knowledge that can help inform and shape the direction of the school.

Those parents who become active on a school council find their involvement satisfying and may also find that their children feel a greater sense of belonging.

Do I need special experience to be on school council?

Each member brings their own valuable skills and knowledge to the role, however, to successfully perform their duties, councillors may need to gain some new skills and knowledge.

It is important to have an interest in your child's school and the desire to work in partnership with others to help shape the school's future.

Code of conduct for school councillors

School councils in Victoria are public entities as defined by the *Public Administration Act 2004*.

School councillors must comply with the Code of Conduct for Directors of Victorian Public Entities issued by the Victorian Public Sector Commission. The Code of Conduct is based on the Victorian public sector values and requires councillors to:

act with honesty and integrity – be truthful, open and clear about their motives and declare any real, potential or perceived conflict of interest and duty

act in good faith in the best interests of the school – work cooperatively with other councillors and the school community, be reasonable, and make all decisions with the best interests of students foremost in their minds

act fairly and impartially – consider all relevant facts of an issue before making a decision, seek to have a balanced view, never give special treatment to a person or group and never act from self-interest

use information appropriately – respect confidentiality and use information for the purpose for which it was made available

exercise due care, diligence and skill – accept responsibility for decisions and do what is best for the school

use the position appropriately – not use the position as a councillor to gain an advantage

act in a financially responsible manner – observe all the above principles when making financial decisions

comply with relevant legislation and policies – know what legislation and policies are relevant for which decisions and obey the law

demonstrate leadership and stewardship – set a good example, encourage a culture of accountability, manage risks effectively, exercise care and responsibility to keep the school strong and sustainable.

Indemnity for school council members

School councillors are indemnified against any liability in respect of any loss or damage suffered by the council or any other person in respect of anything necessarily or reasonably done, or omitted to be done by the councillor in good faith in:

- a. the exercise of a power or the performance of a function of a councillor, or the reasonable belief that the act or omission was in the exercise of a power or the performance of a function of a council.

In other words, school councillors are not legally liable for any loss or damage suffered by council or others as a result of reasonable actions taken in good faith.

How can you become involved?

By participating in, and voting in the school council elections, which are held in Term 1 each year. However, ballots are only held if more people nominate as candidates than there are positions vacant.

In view of this, you might consider:

standing for election as a member of the school council
encouraging another person to stand for election.

What do you need to do to stand for election?

The principal will issue a Notice of Election and Call for nominations in Term 1 of each year. Council elections must be completed by 31 March 2025, unless varied by the Minister for Education.

If you stand for election, you can arrange for someone to nominate you as a candidate or, you can nominate yourself in the parent member category. You can only be nominated by another member of the same electorate that you are eligible for (e.g. a member of the parent electorate may only nominate another parent of that electorate)

Department employees with a child enrolled at a school where they are not engaged in work, are eligible to nominate for parent membership at that school.

Return your completed nomination form to the principal within the time stated on the Notice of Election. You will receive a Nomination Form Receipt via post, email or by hand delivery.

Generally, if there are more nominations than vacancies a ballot will be conducted in the two weeks after the call for nominations has closed.

Remember

Consider standing for election to school council.

Ask the principal for instructions if you are not sure what to do.

Be sure to vote if the election goes to ballot.

Contact the principal if you are unsure about what is required at any stage of the election process.
