Principal's Report

National Bullying week.... Next week, our school will proudly take part in Bullying No Way Week—Australia's national initiative to prevent bullying and build safer, more respectful school communities.

This important week gives us the opportunity to deepen our shared understanding of bullying, reinforce our school's strategies and remind every student that they have the right to feel safe, supported and included.

2026 theme: Small Acts, Big Impact

Bullying is everyone's responsibility and small acts can make a real difference.

This year's theme reminds us that actions don't need to be big to change someone's world.

Small actions – like including someone, speaking up or showing kindness – can create meaningful change.

In our schools and communities, our goal is to build environments where everyone belongs, diversity is celebrated and bullying is never accepted.

During Bullying No Way Week, we encourage students, schools, families and communities to engage in small acts that can have a big impact against bullying.

Throughout the week, students will take part in classroom activities, discussions and events that promote kindness, inclusion and positive behaviours. We'll be encouraging every child to think about how they can make a difference, not just during this week—but every day. This conversation will continue to work within our already successful programs. Whole school approaches, such as implementing the Berry Street Model, has seen our school continue to build on success. This is one of the key elements that has also fed into our students achieving outstanding literacy and numeracy results.
