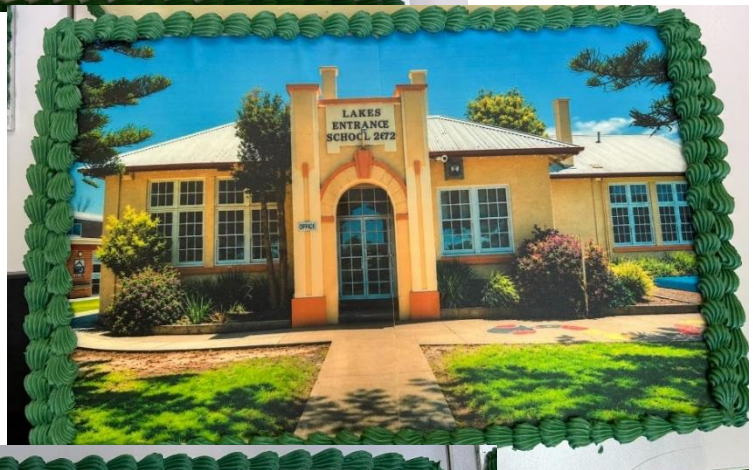

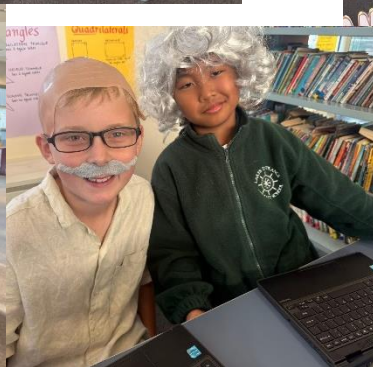

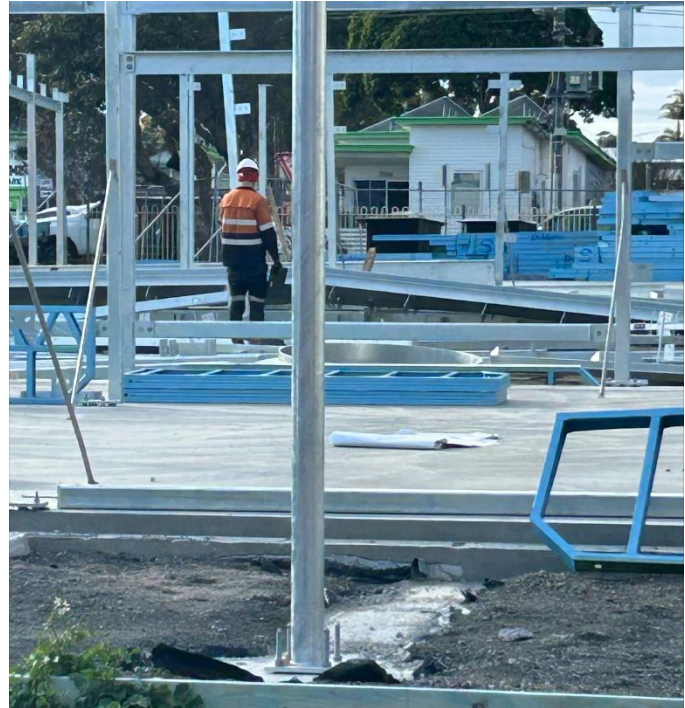
Celebrating 100 years in the Myer Street building...

One of our ex-students, Lloyd Smith, 95 years old, who started at LEPS in 1936, had the honour of presenting our Civic's medals on the day.

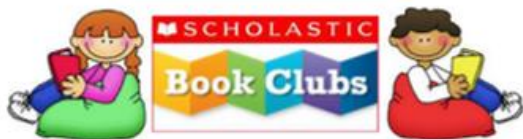


Building works over the holiday break
