Principal's Report

Welcome to 2026: It was great to see so many happy and smiling faces last week when our students returned. Starting a new year is always exciting and all students have settled well into their classrooms as their learning takes off. With months of planning going into programs to start the year, it is always an exciting time for both students and teachers to get this underway.

The establishment of an engaging learning environment and engaging curriculum has been a focus for staff in preparing for the students return. Staff have also spent time discussing key priorities for 2026, ready to ensure our students continue to excel with their learning.

Absent Students: Thank you to those parents who are continuing to notify us in the morning if their child is going to be away from school. Our office is open from 8am to receive any phone calls. These notifications will lead to a decrease in phone calls we are having to make each day around 10am. As a school we must get an indication for every child every day as to why they are not at school. A strong focus on attendance will form a key priority for this year and I am pleased to see our attendance for the first week has been the best in the last 5 years! Starting like this puts us in a strong position to support every child with their learning throughout the year.

This year we are aiming for a **90% attendance rate** for all of our students. A child who slips below 90% runs the risk of missing a significant amount of their schooling over several years.

Parents play an important part in creating an ongoing partnership between home and school for the success of our students.

Building Works: Over the summer holidays lots of work happened around LEPS. The finishing touches are being made to our new ramps around the school, and hopefully will be finished by the end of Term 1. Finally, a builder has been appointed to our next renovation. Meetings will take place over the next few weeks, with work to begin on the 18 month project as soon as possible. While this will see some disruptions in and around the school, the end result will be well worth it, with a brand new library as well as new Prep rooms, Art and STEM centre.

School Council: Last year saw many of our long-standing School Council members finish their time with school and subsequently finish their role with School Council. As a result, we are looking for new members to join. School Council plays a vital role in the overall governance of the school with many different aspects of school operations requiring discussion and approval. It is a relatively easy process throughout the year, with meetings held twice a term for approximately 1hr, in the evening, which can benefit those working during the day with a combination of online and in person meetings. Delilah Austin – Delilah has had a fantastic start to the year. She has settled well, shows kindness to everyone and always tries her best!


Bella Pool – I'm so proud of the way you have settled into your new school and the way you participate in class!





Accident Insurance/Ambulance Cover

Parents and Guardians are reminded that the Department of Education and Training does not provide personal accident insurance or ambulance cover for students. Parents and guardians of students, who do not have student accident insurance/ambulance cover, are responsible for paying the cost of medical treatment for injured students, including the cost of ambulance attendance/transport and any other transport costs.

Student accident insurance/ambulance cover policies are available from some commercial insurers, and can be obtained by parents/guardians for individual students.

Private property brought to school by students, staff or visitors is not insured and the Department does not accept any responsibility for any loss or damage.

Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund 2026

Application forms for the Camps, Sports and Excursions funding support program for 2026 are available at the school office. Parents/Carers who hold a Concession, Pension, Veterans Affairs Gold Card or are temporary Foster Carers are able to claim \$400 per year for eligible primary students.

New families to our school or families who have recently been granted a concession card or families with a child who is in Prep this year need to complete an application form available from the school office, (if you haven't done so already).

This money will be paid directly to the school to offset any camps, sports or excursions. A FAQ sheet as well as an application form is available at the office. **Please contact the office should you have any further questions regarding this matter.**

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
