"Dancing Queen - ABBA Tribute Show" wowed the audience on Saturday June 28th. Opened by Russell Hemming, the show was a dazzling spectacle that transported the audience back to the vibrant disco era of the 1970s.

Russell's energetic introduction set the tone for the evening, as he captured the crowd's excitement with a palpable enthusiasm for the music while guests enjoyed a delicious two course, chef designed dinner.

As the lights dimmed and the first notes began to play, the tribute performers took the stage in glittering costumes reminiscent of ABBA's iconic style. The audience erupted in applause, singing along to every word with infectious enthusiasm.

Throughout the evening, the tribute band flawlessly recreated ABBA's classic hits, from "Mamma Mia" to "Waterloo," each song accompanied by dynamic choreography.





Next year, two students from Leongatha will face the transformative challenge of walking the Kokoda Trek. Leongatha RSL President Bill Verboon made the announcement on Anzac Day, revealing that the Sub Branch will sponsor their educational journey through the Leongatha RSL Kokoda Trek Scholarship.

This annual expedition is organized via the George Collins Kokoda Award program, allowing Leongatha students who will enter Year 11 in 2026 to express their interest when applications become available.

Since its inception in 2007, the George Collins Kokoda Award has enabled 54 students from the Baw Baw Shire to trek Kokoda. During the Leongatha Anzac Commemoration Service attendees heard from one of the initiative's founders, Gary Blackwood, as well as recent participants Leith Metcalfe and Zara McNair.

Leith reflected on the connections forged by those who undertake the trek, the oppressive humidity that "hit like a punch in the guts," and the arduous ascent of Brigade Hill, often referred to as 'the wall.' He recounted standing amidst a sea of white marble headstones, many belonging to individuals his age, and shared his poem that narrates the story of the fighting at Isurava. Although it was clearly an emotional journey, Leith is convinced that hiking the Kokoda Trek brings about profound personal transformation, all for the better.

Zara also recounted numerous challenges but highlighted the joy of playing soccer with local children and her group's porters. She reflects on the Trek daily, remembering the happiness of the local people despite their limited resources. Zara also spoke about her visit to a war cemetery, stating, "They fought hard for our country and gave up everything for us," in reference to those resting beneath the marble headstones.

Once applications open, students interested in joining the program must submit an essay detailing what Kokoda means to them and its significance to Australia today. An interview process follows, and those selected will undergo a training regimen in preparation for the physically and mentally challenging trek. Upon returning from Papua New Guinea, participants serve as Kokoda ambassadors for a year.

The Leongatha RSL urges our community to support the decision to send Leongatha students and have started accepting donations, which can be made at the Leongatha RSL. Various other fundraising initiatives are planned, with a total of \$15,000 needed to send the selected pair of young locals. 



Vietnam Veterans' Day was commemorated with a service at the Leongatha Cenotaph, honoring the Vietnam campaign and the Battle of Long Tan. Lieutenant Colonel (retired) Dr. John Blunt spoke about the 1966 battle, where 108 Australian and Kiwi soldiers faced overwhelming odds against the North Vietnamese army. Seventeen Australians were killed, with over 20 wounded. Dr. Blunt emphasized the sacrifices made and thanked the nearly 60,000 Australians who served during the Vietnam War, which resulted in 524 deaths and almost 3,000 injuries. Bugler Natalie Meadows played hymns while wreaths were being laid then guests enjoyed a light lunch and catch up back at the Leongatha RSL.















# New Updated Access Ramp
