

Principals Report

Hello and welcome back to the start of school for 2022. We are in fact one week into the first term, and things have gotten off to a very smooth start. I have been approached by several parents who want some more information about DET's current COVID policies as they pertain to them. Here is my current understanding. DET has not yet issued enough RAT tests for me to provide every family with the number they would need in order to test twice weekly. When I get enough, then I will distribute them. Taking the tests is 'strongly recommended' but is still up to you. If a positive test happens then the child/children must isolate for seven days and have a negative RAT test in order to return to school. All students need to wear a mask indoors and use hand sanitizer regularly. Parents need to minimise their time at school, also wear masks and socially isolate. Staff at the school need to have their third booster shot and regularly perform RAT tests, if a positive test is returned, they must isolate for seven days and can only return to school following a clear RAT. That's about it at the moment.

If you have any specific questions that I haven't answered then please just make contact and I will do my best to get you an answer.
