PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Welcome to Term 4

Planning for 2019

We are already busy planning for 2019. Student enrolments are as strong as ever, with 85 Preps enrolled for next year. As we are beginning to develop our class structures for 2019 it is helpful if families communicate their intentions with the school. If you have younger children beginning school next year and are yet to enrol, please do so as soon as possible. Likewise, if you intend to enrol elsewhere please notify us.

During this term, we will also develop our new School Strategic Plan for 2019 to 2022. The purpose of school strategic planning is to assist us to develop the goals and targets that we want to achieve for our students, staff and the community. It also enables us to identify the improvement priorities and initiatives to focus on for the next four years.

Parent Requests for 2019 Classes

Parents who have requests for their child's class placement in 2019 are asked to put it in writing to the Principal by Friday 16th November. Requests should focus on the social and academic needs of the child and not simply a request for a particular class or teacher. For example, certain combinations of children may not work well together due to factors at school or beyond the school. If you have put in a request in previous years, please do not rely on that to cover the 2019 school year. A new request needs to be submitted as circumstances are constantly changing. Please do not rely on verbal discussions with staff, as only written requests to the Principal will be considered. All requests will be treated confidentially and we will endeavour to cater for these whenever possible within the set class structure. No requests from parents will be considered after this due date.

Slushies will be available for purchase for students as per the following roster. Slushies can be purchased for \$2 EACH from the Alfred Howitt Hall at lunchtime.



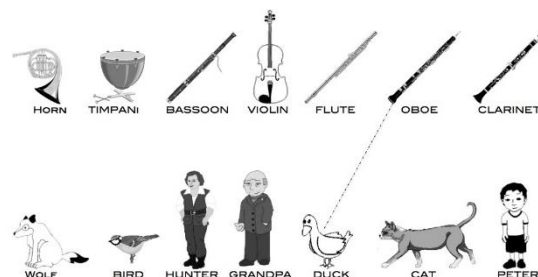

MUSIC NEWS

On October 21st the Gippsland Symphony Orchestra will be performing "Peter and the Wolf" by Prokofiev in Boucher Hall, Bairnsdale Secondary College. This is a musical story with narration and characters depicted by instruments of the orchestra. Lynette Newman (woodwind teacher here at school) will be playing the clarinet which is the cat.

The flute represents the bird in Peter and the Wolf. A string instrument represents the boy, the percussion instrument represents the hunter, and the instrument made of tubing wrapped into a coil with a flared bell represents the wolf. So can you work out which instrument represents Grandpa?

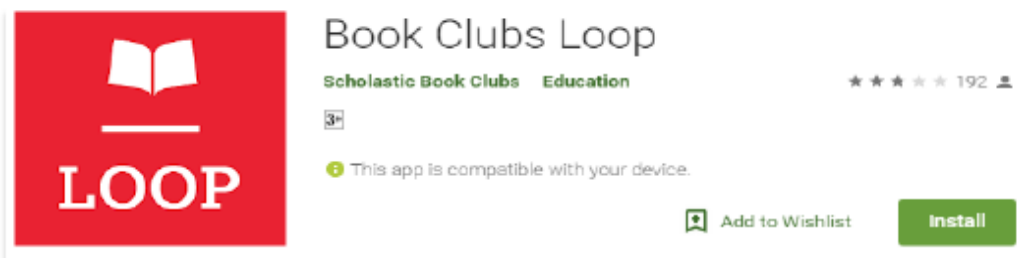
