MUSIC NEWS



What does clarinet mean? Clarinet means little trumpet. It is related to the word clarion - this is like a little trumpet in the shape and it is loud and clear. The clarinet descended from a French instrument the Chalumeau.

The CHALUMEAU is a single-reed woodwind instrument, first produced in France and then moved to Germany. It includes eight finger holes including one at the back for your thumb. (Very much like a recorder except the chalumeau has a reed and mouthpiece.) Johann Denner made improvements to the chalumeau and then eventually developed it into the clarinet.
