- and, most importantly, believe in themselves as readers.


If the books ever feel like a real struggle or cause frustration, please pop in for a chat with your child's teacher — we're here to help make reading at home a positive and enjoyable experience.

#### **OUTDOOR EDUCATION**

As part of this term's Outdoor Education theme on *Fire*, students in Grades 1–6 were fortunate to take part in a fascinating and engaging incursion led by Tim and Alex Elliott from DEECA's Forest Fire Management team.

Students learned about how fire moves through the bush, the different ways DEECA manages fires, and how flora and fauna have adapted to survive and recover from bushfires.

They were shown the specialist protective clothing that firefighters wear, which is treated with chemicals to reduce flammability and protect them while working in dangerous conditions. Tim and Alex also described the specialised training firefighters undertake to ensure they are fully prepared when it's time to respond to a bushfire. In some cases, this even includes abseiling from helicopters into remote areas

to help contain and manage fires. Students also learned about the vital role of controlled burns, which are carefully planned and managed to reduce fuel loads and lower the risk of large, dangerous bushfires.

The session also highlighted the importance of fire breaks. Students discovered that these can occur naturally, such as rivers, or be created by firefighters using bulldozers to scrape away vegetation and expose mineral earth. Using a *fire table*, Tim and Alex gave a very engaging demonstration that showed how fire spreads in a bushfire. This interactive activity helped students understand the links between fire behaviour and factors such as wind direction, slope, aspect, and different fuel types.
