SEMESTER 1 STUDENT REPORTS

Reports will be available online via uEducateUs unless a request is made for a hard copy paper print out.

The report will include the following:

- A personal comment in relation to your child's learning behaviours and social skills.
- A summary of the concepts learnt in Numeracy (Maths) and Literacy (Reading, Writing and Speaking and Listening).
- A summary of the concepts learnt in specialist classes (Visual Art, STEM, Physical Education, Library & Music and Culture).
- Student performance marked against I can statements for the relevant level in Reading, Writing, Number & Algebra and specialist subjects.
- Work habits will be marked against behaviour, effort, work quality, task completion and respect for others.
- Teacher judgement scores.
- Student self-reflection.

Please Note: Some children will not receive a personal comment/I can statements on their report this semester due to protected Australian Education Union industrial action currently occurring across Victorian government schools.

Understanding Teacher Judgement Levels on Student Reports

Following parent feedback, we would like to provide some clarification about the teacher judgement levels that appear in the Learning Areas table on the front of student reports.

The Victorian Curriculum is organised into levels that describe the knowledge and skills students are expected to develop over time. Teacher judgements reflect a student's demonstrated achievement against these curriculum levels at the time of reporting.

The table below provides a guide to the curriculum levels and the point in schooling at which they are typically expected to be achieved.

Curriculum Level	Typical Point of Schooling
0.5	Mid Prep
Foundation (F)	End of Prep
F.5	Mid Grade 1
1.0	End of Grade 1
1.5	Mid Grade 2
2.0	End of Grade 2
2.5	Mid Grade 3
3.0	End of Grade 3
3.5	Mid Grade 4
4.0	End of Grade 4
4.5	Mid Grade 5
5.0	End of Grade 5
5.5	Mid Grade 6
6.0	End of Year 6
6.5	Achievement beyond the expected Year 6 standard

Important Information

- Curriculum levels represent a **learning continuum**, not a grade or percentage score.
- Students may be working above or below the typical level for their year level in different learning areas.
- Teacher judgements are based on a range of assessment evidence collected throughout the semester.
- It is common for students to progress at different rates across Reading, Writing, Mathematics and other curriculum areas.
