WHAT PARENTS NEED TO KNOW ABOUT ROBLOX



Roblox is a free multiplayer online gaming platform which allows users to play and create a variety of games and 3D Worlds. The players can choose games they want to play and can create virtually anything, from a theme park, to becoming a super hero and everything in between. Players can also create their own worlds or games via the Roblox Studio app.

Roblox is available on smartphones, tablets, desktops and Xbox One.

TIPS FOR PARENTS

IS YOUR CHILD UNDER 13?

Make sure that the account is setup to be age appropriate. Under 13 have more automatic restrictions set. However, if you don't have the Parental PIN enabled they can access and change these settings. All accounts should have a level of privacy settings enabled. Check that your child has an age appropriate account.

PRIVACY SETTINGS & PARENTAL CONTROLS

Roblox has account controls that enables parents to restrict how children can interact on the site. You can control whether kids can be contacted, who can message them, and who can chat with them. To enable this, you add your email address to your child's account and create a PIN that prevents them from changing the settings back. You don't have to setup the pin after changing the privacy settings to the level you want, but it is advisable as without it the child can go back and alter those settings. Teach your children about what is good, safe behaviour online and tell them what to do if they see or hear something that makes them uncomfortable. Users can be blocked and reported in Roblox. Blocking is as simple as going to the user profile page, tapping the 3 dots in the upper righthand corner and you can then select Block User. If you want your child to have access but want no contact with other users, turn off in game chat. This can be managed in the account settings where you can completely turn off the chat function all together.

ACCOUNT/AVATAR

The avatar is the user and their information. In account settings check that no personal or private information is being shared. It is recommended that they do not use their real name, and that the photo isn't one of them or one that is recognizable. Do not share social media links, phone numbers, location or anything that could in anyway identify your child. Make sure that they also have a strong password in place and that they do not share that with anyone except a trusted adult. Roblox also has extra security with a 2 Step Verification to prevent your child's account

REMOVE PAYMENT METHODS

Although Roblox is a free-to-play game, there are still plenty of extras that kids want that cost real money. Make sure that no card is linked to the account. This way if they want to make a purchase they must speak to you first - and the negotiations can begin!

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW



MODES OF PLAY

Roblox offers two ways to engage. You can play games or you can create them. Once you have an account you have access to both modes and can choose from a vast supply of ever evolving games. There are fighter, role, games, murder, mystery, sports, all kinds of dance parties, and everything else you can imagine. Kids can build and start to play immediately. In Roblox Studio you build your own games. Creative kids will enjoy the challenge of creating their own games and there are plenty of instructions to help them on their way. Roblox users can play with their anyone, friends or strangers, build and share worlds, and play adventures. The possibilities are endless and therein lies a problem, as this user freedom can mean that there are swarming and spreading your children to every and some corners, but the moderation characters, sensitive, violence, weapons and inappropriate content, are automatically in place. There are an awful lot of people out there who are playing with people who are already friends and family.



PARENTAL CONTROLS

There is no age restriction for Roblox, but users under the age of 13 have some restrictions. Roblox relies on people reporting inappropriate and offensive content and the level of moderation on this platform has been questioned over the years. In 2019 Roblox made the news for the reports of sex rooms and prolific adult content. There are parental controls available and they of course should be used, but even with these in place children may still see inappropriate characters online. Parental controls allow you to restrict how your child can interact on the site. It is advisable you set this up and that they are age appropriate and password protected.



ROBUX MONEY

Robux is the in-game currency for Roblox. Your child will want Robux because they will want to purchase all the cool things in the game, such as weapons, outfits, special abilities and so on. They can buy Roblox with real money, get them as part of your subscription, can trade for them, have them gifted to you or earn them when you charge people to use the games you've created. In theory a user (with a premium subscription who is 13+) can at certain value cash these into real money, but the reality is that most often it is re-invested into the game.



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
