One such event is our 150th Anniversary Celebration which is coming up super quick – next Friday in fact!

150 Year Anniversary Celebration

To celebrate the day, we will all be dressing up in olden day clothing and running school classes as they were (as close to they were), 150 years ago. This will involve old school tasks such as line writing, rote counting and old school games. The students and staff will browse through the LPS Art Show and the Historic Society display during the morning sessions and then we invite the school and broader community, past staff and students to a special assembly commencing at 2pm to hear some stories about the past from former students and staff and to hear of the Indigenous significance of the land on which our school is built. The assembly will open at 2pm with a 'smoking ceremony' on the outside basketball court before moving into the hall for the official welcome. After the ceremony, the CWA will be serving scones and refreshments for \$5 per serve in the foyer of the hall. On the day, you can purchase a commemorative pin for \$5 and a student published and produced newspaper also for \$5. Please bring family and friends along to support this event.
