ICAS ASSESMENTS

Each year, Lucknow Primary School takes part in the International Competitions and Assessments for Schools (ICAS), which gives students from Grades 2-6 the opportunity to measure their own achievement by an external testing body. These tests are held at school and are supervised by teachers. These tests are provided by the University of N.S.W and when completed are marked by ICAS. All students receive a certificate and an individual student report. If you would like your child to participate in all or any of these tests, you will need to register your child online using the parent payment system.

Lucknow has signed up for the ICAS Assessments parent payment system (PPS), this system allows parents to pay for ICAS directly online, tests will still be held at school. Please use the following details to register your child no later than 19th July, 2021.

We will be learning how to incorporate him into some teaching and learning practices and he will be in some ways operating as a staff member.

Rusty will be homed by his primary carer our Instructional Leader of Grade 6 Ms Donna Prince.
