PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Principal Message:

Last Tuesday, many of the Principals and Department staff from the area came to observe our students and staff. They provided feedback to help drive our future planning. There were 6 student forums, 3 staff forums and 1 community forum, and all classes were observed during a writing session.

We are in the process of sorting through all of the feedback received and plan to celebrate the positives and make the areas for improvement a 'to-do' list.

Here is a snapshot of the student feedback:

- What they enjoy most about being a Lucknow PS student: Specialist classes (Art PE and STEM), friends, challenging learning, respectful and inclusive people, monkey bars ©, good teachers who communicate well, leadership opportunities, and lots of support from staff and nice people.
- **This is what helps them to learn:** teachers, friends, helpers, charts around the room and practising the skills they have.
- Areas for improvement: student voice having a more of a choice and say, have maths homework not just reading, longer playtime, to choose your own fun run course, sushi Friday ©, get the Junior School Council back up and running, and longer or more thorough transition to secondary schooling.

Here is a snapshot of the community feedback forum and some feedback I received via email from parents unable to attend:

- **What are the strengths of Lucknow PS**: size of the school, The Growth Mindset approach, wellbeing programs such as Stormbirds, transition to secondary college and the positive culture of our school.
- **Areas for improvement:** the major message was to strengthen the communication between the school and home in all aspects including information about what students are learning and to bring back parent/teacher interviews.

I will get out more information and feedback as we continue to strive for excellence in teaching and learning.

Thank you to all staff, student and community members who were involved – this will be invaluable feedback for us in our endeavour for excellence.

A special 'thank you' to Jararah and Rhani of year 5 for their 'Welcome to Country' to open our meeting – well done, it was very brave of you to stand up in front of all of those scary Principals and you did a great job!



Parent/Teacher Interviews:

These interviews will be about providing feedback to families about what their child/ren have learnt and how they have worked through Term One and setting goals for Term Two. What is a Professional Learning Community (PLC)?

A Professional Learning Community (PLC) involves staff working together to constantly focus on improving the learning outcomes for all students.

What does this look like at Lucknow PS?

Our school has been operating as a Professional Learning Community (PLC) for the last 7 years. Teachers of the same year level meet for 2 hours each week whilst students are off enjoying specialist subjects. During this time the PLC focuses on the results from assessments, explores professional readings, discusses students work and plans the upcoming learning tasks. It's crucial that the team identifies what the students can do well, what they need to improve and how the staff will cater for all the differing learning needs.

How does a PLC benefit your child?

- Teachers have a strong understanding of what your child can do and what their next steps are. This is shared with your children and learning goals are established.
- Learning tasks are planned to target your child's point of need.
- Children regularly complete assessment tasks to check in on their learning.
- Multiple teachers oversee your child's learning and assist in the planning and assessing process.
- Staff have high expectations and believe that every child can learn and grow.
- Children are appropriately challenged and learning growth is celebrated.
- Teachers are constantly striving to improve their practice through completing professional readings and observing one another teach.






Matchbox Car Maths

Then we used this to make a graph showing how data changes into something that can give us information.


We had fun doing this activity because even though it was learning, we didn't really feel like it was!


We wish all our Cross Country competitors the best of luck and we look forward to hearing the results after the event.

The grade that raised the most money was **1ES**. They raised a total of **\$1477.20** which was a great group effort. Well Done


1ES! The class will receive \$50.00 to have a class party to celebrate such a wonderful achievement.
