All our students have been participating in music classes with me on a Wednesday or Thursday. This usually entails singing some songs, playing rhythm games and learning to play the ukulele.

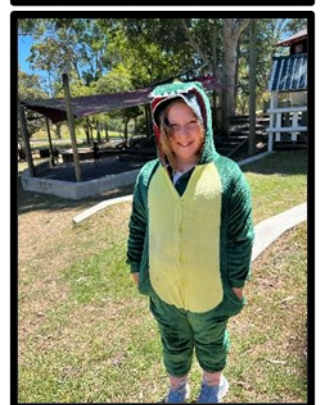
Mr. Jeanes was in on Friday and has started to create 'Grass Haired Socks'. It has been suggested that it could be a cure for baldness for him and me.

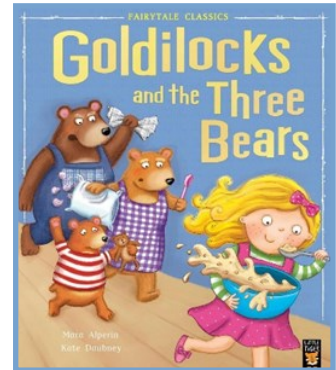

# Grade Prep

This term our classroom theme is 'Fairy Tales'.

Over the past two weeks we have enjoyed integrating 'Goldilocks and the Three Bears' into our program. The students have enjoyed listening to different versions of the story, viewing a PowerPoint presentation, illustrating the story, role playing, drawing pots of honey for the bears (one to one matching) and making porridge to enjoy.



In the area of reading, the Prep students are working in small guided reading groups. We have been focusing on 'Getting our Knowledge Ready' before reading texts. This includes looking at the cover and predicting what may happen in the story. We are building a range of reading strategies, such as using the pictures, getting our mouth ready and pointing to the words.

The students are also being introduced to decodable texts. In these sessions our focus is on a phonics warm-up, reading and enjoying the book, word reading, vocabulary, fluency and comprehension.

Each week the children will receive sight word and letter cards to practise. They also have their Mathletics and ABC Reading Eggs login details on the back of their reader covers. They are welcome to use these programs at home.

After School Care is available from 3.20pm-4.20pm Mon-Fri.

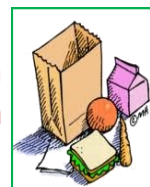
\$10.00 is charged for the first child per session, with each subsequent child charged \$5.00.

**Apply**  
If you meet the criteria and would like to apply to join the TAC L2P Program, you can do this through the myVicRoads website. It is available on the website under the 'TAC L2P Learner Driver Mentor Program' page.

**Via the myVicRoads website**  
Sign up for a myVicRoads account if you don't have one. A myVicRoads account allows you to access your registration and licensing details online, manage your personal information and make online payments easily and securely. Once you have created an account:  
• Navigate to 'Licences and Learner Permits' in your account.  
• Scroll to the bottom of the page and select 'Apply as a learner or mentor in the TAC L2P Program' to go to either learner or mentor online application form.  
• To find your nearest L2P program visit the L2P page on the VicRoads website where you can enter your postcode to locate your nearest program. Then select the program from the drop down list.
