### **Principal's Report**

Wuman Njinde Parents, Students and the School Community,

Welcome to this fortnight's newsletter where we share Newmerella's school journey and achievements.

What a very challenging week many of our families have had due to their child contracting Influenza A. At school we are continuing to be vigilant, and practice good hygiene. The school already has regular routines and habits in place. These include washing hands with soap and water before eating, having the air purifiers on in the classrooms (Filters are regularly replaced each term), having doors and windows open, reminding children to cough into their arm and Nola our cleaner is cleaning the tables daily in each classroom. We have upped the ante this week, and Nola is sanitizing the door handles daily and we are reminding children to use the hand sanitizer after blowing their nose. If your child is experiencing cold and flu-like symptoms, please remember to keep them at home.

The school is beginning the early stages of planning for our staff, education support staff, and classroom structures for 2026 so we can meet the needs of all our students and families. We know that families move for a variety of reasons - whether due to work, lifestyle changes, or schooling choices. If your family is considering a move or change of school before 2026, we would greatly appreciate a conversation. This will help us in our planning and ensure a smooth transition for your child to their new school.

Just a reminder that our drop off zone is not available for parking in the morning and/or afternoon periods. Parents should not leave their cars. Students without parents in the yard will continue to be asked to remain near the front gate to facilitate a quick pick up and to enable traffic to flow freely. Students who have not been picked up by 3:30 will be asked to go to the office and parents will be called.

Congratulations to Kaitlyn M and Charlotte B who are representing our school at the next division stage of athletics. Kaitlyn's events are discus and shotput, and Charlotte's event is 1500m.

Each year in September all schools are required to update their Emergency Management Plans (EMP). The review includes identifying areas where the EMP could be improved and ensuring the whole school community is aware of the plan and their role during an emergency. Each term we are required to run an emergency management drill which can include bushfire/lock down, off site evacuation, shelter in place /explosion etc. Last week we conducted our Term 3 drill which was based on a gas explosion scenario. Whilst the school didn't leave the school grounds, in a real emergency, we would be locating the school to our offsite location which is the vacant lot several blocks down from the school.

Parents can assist the school by doing the following below so that if a real emergency was to present, everyone's whereabouts is accounted for.

Sign your child in through the office if they are late to school (This cannot be done by the child alone, they must be accompanied by their parent/guardian)

- 2. Sign your child out through the office if they are leaving early.
- 3. Sign in yourself if you are volunteering or meeting at the school during school hours. Sign out when you are leaving.

In addition, parents are asked to assist in the following ways:

1. If we are holding an EMP drill when you are at the school, we ask that you follow all the instructions and also be involved.

In the case of a real emergency, follow all the instructions that will be provided through Compass, particularly if you are not at the school. We will provide instructions to parents with the

guidance of the emergency services. (If you are asked to stay away from the school, this will be done for the safety of everyone, and this decision will come from the DET).

Ensure you have Compass available either on your phone, tablet or computer so you can keep up to date with instructions. Check your password regularly to ensure you have access.

#### **Evacuation Points**

Our onsite evacuation point is the basketball court. A green evacuation sign is displayed on the fence.

Our Shelter in Place is Class 1 and 2.

Our Offsite Evacuation points are the Newmerella CFA Station and the vacant lot several doors down from the school on McLaughlin's Road.

#### First Aid

In order for us to support your child both at school each day and in the case of emergency, we need to be aware of their first aid needs. Please ensure this is up to date.

#### **Contact details**

Thank to our parents for providing the school with updated personal information as it relates to a change of address, contact numbers, emergency contact names and numbers etc. This information is crucial to ensure the school has processes in place if your child is sick, injured and/or for communication purposes.


