

# **Specialist News**

#### PF

The swimming program has been going well. To complement the program all the students have been learning about water safety. This includes keeping safe around the pool and different scenarios at the beach, rivers and around the home.

#### Digi-tech

Across the school in Digi-tech, students have been exploring the difference between hardware and software in relation to computers. This has involved learning about how hardware is the physical components of the computer, including the internal parts we cant see through the cover. It has also included learning about how software is the programs run by the computer, including things such as Microsoft Word, games, PowerPoint, Google, etc.

#### Art

The study of art comprises of 7 different elements, the P/1 class has been discussing different types of lines. They then watched how Mr. Squiggle turned different lines into a picture. Then they had a go at turning my lines into a picture with some fantastic results!

The 2/3s have continued to work on their paper mache creatures. Some of them have started to paint them.

The 4/5/6s started some work on value (another one of the 7 elements). They are learning how to use value (shades and tints) to make drawings look 3D. Whilst the 5/6s were on camp, the 4s learnt about how to draw using perspective.

#### Science

In science this term we are still learning about rocks and have done some rock testing, rock sorting and rock classification. We have begun looking at crystals and gemstones and are making our own crystals in the classroom! Students are loving bringing in special rocks and stories to share.

#### Music

The P/1 and the 2/3 class have been practising an original Eureka Stockade rap which tells the story of the battle between the miners and the troopers. They have also been working in small groups to compose beat and accent instrumentals.


The 3/4 class has been sorted into 3 piece bands that have composed their own arrangements of 'Hailfire Peaks.'
