To celebrate the end of term we will be having a Crazy Hair/Pyjama Day next Friday 25th June.



PREP/1

In maths we have started looking at friends of 10. We know that = means 'the same as.' Students have explored the different ways that they can make 10. The numbers always equal 10 even when we change the combinations. Students have been using 10's frames and the part-whole model to show the different ways they can make 10. Our goal is to become automatic with friends of 10 facts.

In reading we have continued using our meaning making motors to say and read tricky words using blending, syllables and rhyming words. We are now moving into finding the meaning of tricky words to ensure we understand what we are reading. Well done to students and families for making the effort to read every night. I know how hard this time of year is and how tired everyone is. Thank you for your continued effort.

In writing we have been working on our handing and self-reflections for our mid-year reports. Students are reflecting on their school year so far. They have written about something they like, something they are good at and something they need to practise. Students are thinking about the sounds they can hear in words and having a go at writing on their own. They have done drafts, had a go at editing and then completed a good copy. It has been fantastic to see students being self-aware of what they are good at and what they need to practise. They have put in a lot of effort into their reflections and we hope you enjoy reading them.

GRADE 3/4

In reading students have been completing tasks from Bloom's Taxonomy relating to their guided reading book.

In writing we have continued to work on our Space Stories which we began in remote learning. Students have been rereading their stories, learning to edit them effectively. To help with this we have co-created an editing checklist which has all the things a good story needs to have in it. Then they have been typing a final draft learning to use the features of Word more successfully.

Many students are becoming much more comfortable subtracting numbers that involve trading. This week we have embarked on our Glass Task investigation. They investigate different ways to package and send glasses working within constraints and finally must prove their conjectures. Students navigate their own way through each stage of learning, choosing their own methods. We are off to a fantastic start and we are excited about where this learning will lead us.

GRADE 1/2

In maths we have explored and discussed what the "equals" symbol means. We now know that it means 'the same' and that we can use it to show equivalent number sentences. This lead into work on 'friends of ten'. If my whole is ten, what might my parts be? We have started to test our automatic recall by playing 'friends of ten' snap. We have also begun to extend this knowledge in to 'compliments of 100'.

We thoroughly enjoyed reading Olga the Brolga. We discussed what things put us in a bad mood, and what might have put Olga in a terrible mood. We also discussed the problem in the story- that Olga wanted someone to dance with her. We made predictions about what we thought Olga might try to solve the problem. Being nice to the people she asks instead of loud and obnoxious was definitely one of our suggestions of what she could do differently next time! A few people guessed that she might start dancing on her own, and were thrilled to find their prediction was correct!

We have written recounts about the morning tea held for the playground opening just before we went into lockdown. We all thought that the amount of different types of food and the presentation was amazing. We also wrote recounts about what we did during lockdown. We practiced using our editing finger chart to improve and correct our writing.

GRADE 5/6

In reading we have continued to work on our research projects about "Australian's at War" and have developed a shared success criteria to make sure we have included everything a project needs.

In writing we have worked to improve our space stories begun during remote learning. We developed a shared success criteria checklist and used this to make sure we worked efficiently through the writing process. We are publishing this week.

In maths we have been working hard to develop efficient subtraction strategies. This week we have embarked on our Glass Task investigation. They investigate different ways to package and send glasses working within constraints and finally must prove their conjectures. Students navigate their own way through each stage of learning, choosing their own methods. We are off to a fantastic start and we are excited about where this learning will lead us.
