Dear Families,

As this week commemorates the Anzacs I am reflecting on the peace and safety that we are able to enjoy in Australia. My heart also goes out to those nations in conflict, especially Ukraine and Sudan. It is my hope that these countries can come to peace soon.

As a teenager I spent seven years in the Air Cadets and had the great privilege of meeting many service men and women when marching in the Melbourne Anzac day March. I recollect feeling grateful to these

people as I opened the dawn service leading a parade of fifty or so Air Cadets.

Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people served in our armed forces throughout the wars.



In WW2 Almost every able bodied Torres Strait Islander male had enlisted.

At this time I would like to acknowledge the service of my Great Grand Uncle Albert Franklin who served in WW1 in

Egypt. He was one of many indigenous enlisted men. I would also like to acknowledge the service of my Great Uncle Gordon who resided in Swifts Creek after WW2 and my Great Aunt Irene who served in the air force.

### **COVID-19 Guidelines**

COVID-19 Guidelines - With the coming of cooler weather we may see an upsurge of COVID-19 cases. The following guidelines apply at this stage -

It is recommended that rapid antigen tests (RATs) are used by students and staff:

- If you have symptoms of COVID-19 infection, no matter how mild
- If you are a household or close contact of someone who has COVID-19
- If you are a social contact of someone who has COVID-19.

Students who report a positive result are recommended to isolate for a minimum of 5 days and not attend school until their symptoms have resolved. Students who isolate as a result of a positive COVID-19 test should be supported in the same way as students with an extended absence due to illness or injury, with learning materials provided to support their continued learning.

<u>Parents/carers</u> should contact the school if a <u>student</u> tests positive to COVID-19 (via a PCR or rapid antigen test). Please contact the school if you require Rapid Antigen Tests.

breakfast options such as cut up fresh fruit, baked beans and porridge.. Thanks to Renata and Ryan for their work every week in providing this opportunity for your children.


